Cemeteries Are Movable

Large cities, almost without exception, and a great many smaller communities have had to move their cemeteries not once but many times and usually for sanitary reasons. La Grande has already undergone this ordeal and has no assurance that the future will not bring a repetition. We do not know of a cemetery anywhere whose officials absolutely guarantee undisturbed perpetual possession of burial lots notwithstanding the fact that warranty deeds are given.

In many other instances cemeteries have been abandoned when all the available space was occupied and the consequent neglect has resulted in utter desolation.

It is evident that the dead are not secure unless in an immovable structure.

Mausoleums Not Movable

Community Mausoleums meet the demands of those not satisfied with the temporary character of the grave. These steel-reinforced monolithic concrete structures not only are imperishable and immovable but also are entirely sanitary, therefore they are exempt from disturbance by the health authorities.

Nor is the Community Mausoleum ever abandoned, because the permanent endowment fund is placed on the building as a whole, not on single crypts, and is not subject to recall by crypt-owners. In this way the entire building is taken care of. Weeds do not grow on the marble face of the snow-white vault even if the friends of the deceased never visit it. Which appeals to you, the temporary grave or the permanent Community Mausoleum?

WHEAT CROP SHORT HERE

OREGON FIGURES 4,000,000 UNDER 1916.

Apples More Productive Than Last Year in This State.

Oregon's wheat crop is 4,000,000 bushels short of last year, according to complete government crop reports issued in Washington yesterday and portions of which the Observer announced at that time. The same forecast declares that in Oregon more apples will be raised this year than last but in the country at large, the apple production is below 1915. Following are some of the figures issued by the government:

Winter Wheat.
Oregon: Preliminary estimate 12,500,000 bushels; production last year (final estimate), 16,200,000 bushels.

United States: Preliminary estimate 455,000,000 bushels; production last year (final estimate), 655,045,000 bushels.

Spring Wheat.
Oregon: August 1 forecast, 4,460,000 bushels; production last year (final estimate), 3,825,000 bushels.

United States: August 1 forecast, 199,000,000 bushels; production last year (final estimate), 356,460,000 bushels.

Potatoes.
Oregon: August 1 forecast, 6,790,000 bushels; production last year (final estimate), 5,520,000 bushels.

United States: August 1 forecast, 364,000,000 bushels; production last year (final estimate) 359,109,000 bushels.

Hay.
Oregon: August 1 forecast 1,820,000 tons; production last year (final estimate), 1,870,000 tons.

United States: August 1 forecast, 84,600,000 tons; production last year (final estimate), 85,225,000 tons.

Apples.
Oregon: August 1 forecast, 1,210,000 barrels; production last year (final estimate), 1,043,000 barrels.

United States: August 1 forecast, 71,600,000 barrels; production last year (final estimate) 76,670,000 barrels.

Pendleton Market Fluctuates.
Pendleton, Aug. 8.—Wheat today, after a drop of a point and a half this morning has again mounted to 97 cents and some sales are being entered at that price. Yesterday saw a number of contracts made with the farmers but they did not reach the point made during the last few days of the week previous. Indications were this noon that the close of the day would see sales aggregating a total equal to any day this season.

Prospects of rain, with a wavering tendency in the Chicago market have decided many of the farmers to take no further chances and they are now willing to make terms with the buyers. With the drop this morning and the relatively weak market of yesterday some of the ranchers were admitting that they should have sold at the high price of Saturday when 98 cents was paid to a few fortunate ones.

It is now estimated that there has been contracted fully a million and a quarter bushels of 1916 wheat and the total will probably reach near a million and a half. Today's sales will bring it up to that amount, it is expected.

Despite the storm, most of the harvesting crews are at work today and the accounts, in a measure, for the small sales of the first of the week.
