**Meals and Lunches for Recruits.** United States Army Recruiting Station, Federal Bldg., La Grande, Oregon, Aug. 9.—Sealed proposals, in triplicate, made out on the form next following, will be received here until 4 o'clock p. m., August 19, 1916, and then opened, for furnishing meals and lunches for the recruiting party, recruits, and applicants for enlistment in the U. S. Army at the above named recruiting station during the period commencing August 20, 1916.

The meals furnished must be substantial and of wholesome quality, in suitable proportions of meat (or fish,) bread, vegetables, sugar, coffee, or tea, and the usual seasoning; to be well cooked and satisfactory quantity supplied. In addition to the meals, soap shall be furnished in the proportion of one pound to each 75 meals, and matches at the rate of six boxes per month, without extra charge. ### Notice of Proposed Sewer Construction.

Notice is hereby given to all concerned that the Commission of the City of La Grande, Oregon, deems it expedient and proposes to improve Section 6 of Sewer District No. 1 of the City of La Grande, Oregon, by constructing therein a sanitary sewer and assessing the cost thereof to the property in said district affected by and to be benefited by said proposed improvement and upon which an assessment is to be levied for the construction of such sewer has made and filed in writing its report and the Commission has examined, acted up-

on, and adopted the same: That the boundaries of the district proposed to be so improved are as follows, to-wit: Commencing at the center of the intersection of Grandy avenue in Grandy's second addition to the town of La Grande, Union county, Oregon, and Cedar street in said addition, and running thence north along the center line of Cedar street in the center of the intersection of Cedar street and Palmer avenue in said Grandy's second addition; thence west along the center line of said Palmer avenue to the center of the intersection of said Palmer avenue and Oak street in said addition; thence south along the center line of Oak street to the center of the intersection of said Oak street and Grandy avenue in said addition; and thence east along the center line of said Grandy avenue to the place of beginning:

That the construction of such sanitary sewer is to be made in accordance with and under the plans and specifications adopted by the Commission of the City of La Grande, therefor on the 28th day of June, 1916, and the said proposed improvements, generally, are to be as follows, to-wit: The construction of a vitrified 8-inch sanitary sewer along the center of the alley in block 8 of Grandy's second addition to the town of La Grande, Oregon, to the center of Grandy avenue in said addition and there connecting with the present sanitary sewer, and making all necessary excavations and fills for such construction: That the Commission of the City of La Grande, Oregon, will meet at 7:30 o'clock p. m. Wednesday the 16th day of August, 1916, at the Commission room in the City building in La Grande, Oregon, and hear and determine all objections, remonstrances and claims of grievance of any person interested in such proposed improvement or the property affected thereby and that all objections, remonstrances and claims of grievance must be filed in writing with the recorder of the city before the time set for such hearing.
