Stockholm, Sweden, Aug. 15.—The All-American Soccer team is here and ready today to meet the All Stockholm aggregation in the only 1916 international soccer contest scheduled. The Americans are acclimated and prepared to give the Swedes a big run for their money. A second game with the same aggregation will be played the 18th and on August 22nd the All-Sweden eleven will battle the Americans. From here the Americans will go to Gothenburg where it plays August 25th. The tour will close with the final game at Christiania on the 28th. The American aggregation, which sailed from Hoboken for Christiania late in July, is the guest in Norway and Sweden of the Stockholm Gymnastic & Sporting association.

**First Play in National Tennis Doubles**  
Lake Forest, Ill., Aug. 15.—First play in the preliminary national tennis doubles started on the Onwentsia club courts here today. **Veterans of Foreign Wars Meet.**  
Chicago, Aug. 14.—Uncle Sam's sons of empire met here today to talk of the time when they carried the flag into China, the Philippines, Cuba, Vera Cruz and the "coral reefs and desert sands" where the United States army, navy or marine corps has fought in the past two decades. Several thousand of them, members of the veterans of the Foreign Wars of the United States are attending the seventeenth annual encampment of the national organization. They came prepared to talk preparedness. Grand Commander Gus E. Hartung of Denver, and Adjutant General Col. R. G. Woodside of Pittsburgh were early arrivals. Delegates are here from the Philippines and Canal Zone posts. Delegates displayed with pride their Campaign Badges. This badge, issued by Congress to men who saw active service in the Philippines, Haiti, Santo Domingo or Cuba, was the official badge of the encampment. The favorite campaign discussed today was that of General Winfield Scott, made from Vera Cruz to Mexico City in 1846. The massacre at the Alamo was re-enacted, the sinking of the
