ACCUSED ENTER PLEAS.

Trio Suspected of Frisco Dynamiting Maintain Their Innocence.

San Francisco, Aug. 21.—Warren K. Billings, Thomas Hooney and Mrs. Rena Mooney all pleaded not guilty to murder charges in connection with recent preparedness parade dynamiting when many were killed. Defense Counsel McNutt withdrew the defendant's motions to quash the indictments against Edward Nolen and Israel Weinburg. McNutt told the judge he wanted 30 days to prepare a defense.

The premier was elevated to the new dignity by the Emperor along with several score other prominent Japanese, during the ceremonies at the Imperial Palace in commemoration of Japan's successes in the war with Germany, the conclusion of an agreement with China and the new Russo-Japanese treaty. The event was made a national holiday, celebrated by all the cities in Japan.
