Dutch Army Prepared. The Hague, Netherlands, June 30. (Correspondence of the Associated

Press.)—Interesting information as to what has been accomplished in preparing the Dutch army for modern warfare in the 21 months during which it has now been on a war footing was contained in a statement presented to Parliament by the Minister of War, Major-General N. Bosboom, when he asked for a fresh appropriation of \$40,000,000 to cover mobilization expenses.

Even a partial demobilization is still out of the question, according to the War Minister.

Answering the question whether the Dutch Army was adequately prepared for war and whether the material and equipment fulfill modern requirements, he said, that although it was inadvisable to make public information which might benefit a possible enemy, there was no doubt the Dutch soldiers could face the prospect of war with confidence.

In August, 1914, the material and equipment left much to be desired. The workshops of the kingdom were not ready for mass production. These shops have been enlarged and 100 factories have been equipped for the production of war material.

Searchlights for coast defense, land positions, and field troops have been increased. Automobile stations for wireless telegraphy have been formed. The Army has at its disposal a great number of motor lorries for the transport of troops and wounded.

As regards the medical service, the reserve hospital accommodation has been increased by arrangements with 150 civilian nursing institutions.

An unfavorable comment on the relations between commanders and men in the Dutch army is the fact, now made known, that many thousands of soldiers persisted in going on furlough at Easter, when leave was refused them owing to the special circumstances that made the position dangerous for Holland.

BAKER AUTO GOES IN DITCH

TRAIL THROUGH EASTERN OREGON TO BE MARKED.

Death Trap at Weatherby Considered by the Officials.

Baker, Aug. 23.—Victor Basche and George McIntyre sustained minor bruises, the roadster in which they were riding was completely lost from sight in an irrigation ditch and a fox terrier, the property of Glenn Shockley, was mysteriously lost shortly after midnight this morning, when the car left the road at a sharp turn one and a half miles northeast of the city.

The machine was being driven at high speed and failed to answer instantly to the turn of the wheel as a sharp crook in the road was reached. Plunging straight ahead, it hurled the six foot irrigation ditch, knocked down part of the fence beyond and catapulted Mr. McIntyre over the wire into a hay field.

Mr. Basche, accompanied by Ed Reynolds started work shortly before noon, raising the car by the use of a derrick.

Removing Death Trap. To endeavor to effect an agreement with the O.-W. R. & N. company in the matter of eliminating the death trap grade crossings at Weatherby and Lime, the Baker county court will meet here with Division Superintendent Bollons of La Grande Wednesday, September 6, Commissioner W. J. Welch announced this morning, shortly before the adjournment of the special two-day session of the court.

The proposition made by the railroad for eliminating two crossings each at Lime and Weatherby, involves an even division of expense between railroad and county and the offer to use all waste dirt taken out in extending a passing track at the two points.

The commissioners, on the other hand, believe that the railroad should bear more than half the expense, declaring that the road was in existence before the track was laid.

Baker, Union and Umatilla Co-operating to Mark Trail.

Signs are now being prepared by Baker painters and will be placed beginning either the latter part of this week, or the first part of next week. Posts will be white with a black stripe and will bear either the letter "R" or "L," indicating that the trail turns either to the right or left.

School Credit Projects Helpful

The idea that certain practical work done by boys and girls on the farms should count as credits in the agricultural courses of the rural elementary and high schools is growing rapidly in popularity among educators.

To assist the superintendents of schools and teachers, the specialists in agricultural education in the States Relations Service have recently published Department Bulletin 385, School Credit for Home Practice in Agriculture.

The parent should agree: (1) To permit the pupil to use specified land, animals, and equipment either as a temporary owner or as a tenant so far as the needs of the project are concerned; (2) to grant the pupil the time needed for the work and to verify and vouch for the time record; (3) to instruct the pupil in the necessary manipulation so far as practicable; (4) to allow the pupil the profits derived from his own labor and management.

fully. Where the pupil's time is much needed by the parent in regular home duties it may be well to advise that the pupil take over some part of that home work as a project.

This will insure the cooperation of the parents, although the "managerial" income may not come to the pupil. The school should not only give credit for work for which the pupil receives pay, but should consider the relative income or profit as one important factor in determining the school rank given on the project.

To insure success it will be very desirable to have a memorandum of agreement signed by all parties before the project begins, a report in full from the pupils, and a voucher from the parent at the end.
