Oregon Agricultural College, Corvallis, Aug. 23.—Harvey Lee Lantz, of Cove, who was graduated in horticulture last June, has been appointed a fellow of horticulture at the Iowa State college, Ames, Iowa. Mr. Lantz was recognized by Professor C. I. Lewis, head of the horticultural department at O. A. C., as one of the strong students.
