### Spokane Plants Trout.

Spokane, Wash., Aug. 31.—Enough trout to provide a weekly feast for 100,000 people for four months have been planted in the lakes and streams of Spokane county this year, according to the annual report of the game commission.

As a part of the campaign which Spokane sportsmen are waging to make this section the fisherman's paradise, 1,665,000 eastern brook, silver, rainbow, cut-throat and steel-head trout have been liberated in waters around Spokane this year, while in 1915 the plantings aggregated more than 2,000,000. Within a year it is estimated each of these fish will weigh a pound.

"Similar work is in progress to provide good sport for the hunter. This year the county game commission has distributed thousands of Chinese and silver pheasants and quail.
