YANK BAKE AT LAKE SUNDAY

MANAGER EGANSPARGER WILL GIVE BIG SHOW.

Sport Notes.

New York, Sept. 1.—A new star has flashed among the great second basemen in the American league.

Buried among the substitutes on the bench of the New York Yankees, and used as an outfielder, a first baseman and a pinch hitter, Charley Mullen a short time ago got into the game as a second baseman after he had formed a habit of breaking up games with hits in the pinches.

Mullen's hitting during the convalescence of a number of the New York stars was the real bright spot in the playing of that club. He first jumped into prominence in a game against Detroit when he doubled with two runners on and tied the score. Eventually New York won that game.

Again, in New York, two runners were on the sacks in a game with Cleveland and New York needed two runs to tie the score. Mullen was sent in to hit for the pitcher and he responded with a double against the left field wall which sent the tying runs across.

Mullen was sent to second base a few days later to supplant Joe Gedeon, whose hitting since the first few weeks of the season has been practically nil. Mullen's first day's work as a regular consisted of three hits, one of them sending the winning runs across the rubber. That game helped send Chicago down in the percentage column.

He was "discovered" by Charles Comiskey when he was playing first base on the wonderful Seattle high school team which made a trip across the country several years ago. Comiskey signed the youngster and when he showed up the following year at the Chicago park Comiskey sent him to Lincoln, Neb., where he played a couple of years and then became manager of the club.

Mullen managed the club all of one year and was starting on his second season when Arthur Irwin recommended his purchase to the New York club. Mullen was hitting .370 at that time and leading Western League batters. The owner of the Lincoln club didn't like to part with his manager, but a deal was finally arranged, the Yankees stipulating that Mullen should hit .260 or better to bring a certain price. Mullen's last day of play boosted his average to exactly .260.

Catcher Pat Haley, now with the Athletics, once had a trial with the Red Sox, but was relegated to Providence, where Connie Mack found him.

Golfers Caddy for Their Caddies. Chicago, Sept. 1.—All golf courses in and around Chicago were caddyless today. Even at the Exmoor country club, where the annual caddy tournament was being played, regular caddies were not to be found.

Instead, all the erstwhile Chicago caddies were here as golfers, officially representing their home clubs and competing for gold watches, suits of clothes, money prizes and club honors, while well to do and portly Chicago golfers caddied for them.

Under the auspices of the Chicago District Golf association, five representatives of the caddies from each club participated.

The tournament was divided into two classes, the first made up the amateur class, all boys under 16; the second of boys over 16, who are considered professionals under the rules of the U. S. A.

Golf club members doing the caddy work replaced divots and flagpoles and quickly responded to the orders of their "masters" when a certain club called for to make a play.
