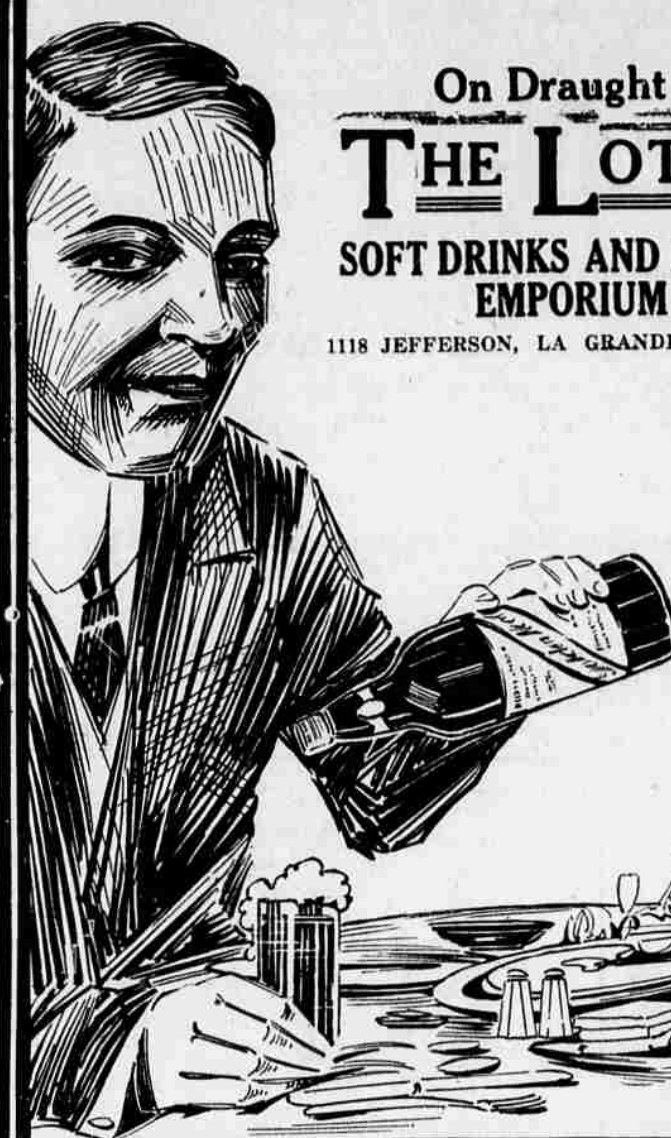

SPORTSMEN AT ANNUAL FEED

L. M. HOYT MADE PRESIDENT
AGAIN.

Gets Biggest Fish.

Seldom have the fish been fried as nearly perfect, the spuds done brownier, the embellishments nearer O. K. at any fish feed than was the rule last night when the 1916 annual fish feed was given by the Wing, Fin & Fleetfoot club at the Foley grill. The attendance was good, and for three hours the members were entertained at good eats, speeches and by other means. Election of officers for the ensuing year took place, and prizes won in the contest Sunday and Monday were awarded.

In the first place there were oodles of fish for everybody. After the dinner, President Hoyt distributed the prizes, after a vote had been taken which unanimously carried, to the effect that those contestants who quit fishing in time to reach La Grande Tuesday noon when contest closed, but were denied their aim by serious automobile troubles. Second largest rainbow—John Thiesen with 14 7-8ths inch trout.
Third largest rainbow—Ernest Flesser with 14 1-4 inch trout.
Fourth largest rainbow—Ellis Kirtley with 14 1-8th inch trout.
Fifth largest rainbow—Bert Hughes with 14-inch trout.
Sixth largest rainbow—A. V. Andrews with 13 7-8th inch trout.
Largest bull trout—Will Kelly with 14 1-4 inch trout.
Second largest bull trout—William Miller with 12 5-8th inch trout.
There being no Eastern Brook trout "in captivity" the seventh largest rainbow was awarded to Frank Coulton with a 13 inch trout.

Later on in the evening most of the winners told how they caught 'em, but in most instances dwell principally on the scenic wonders in the Troy country. Game Warden John Walden and Circuit Judge Knowles were among others who spoke.

One of the important events of the evening was to give a standing vote of thanks and three cheers for A. A. Wenzel who has been the secretary since the club was formed, and who leaves soon for the east. No sportsman in the county has done more for fish and game in the past three or four years and his services will be sorely missed.

The annual election was held. L. M. Hoyt was put back in office for the third time as president in recognition of his close attention and able administration of his office. Pat Foley was re-elected vice president, and S. D. Crowe was named the new secretary and was given the added office of being treasurer too.

For the election of four new executive members, considerable fun developed. A big field was listed and from them were picked J. W. Knowles, A. V. Andrews, Bert Hughes and Walt Zweifel.

The constitution was ordered changed so that the election of officers will be held at each annual fish feed instead of in January.
