TRAGEDY IS EXPLAINED.

Jealously the Cause of Murder and Suicide in Baker.

Baker, Sept. 8.—(Special)—The funeral of Mrs. Mary Baker, who was shot to death by Harry Shoemaker, the latter committing suicide after the deed, will be held this afternoon. George Howard, the only witness of the affair, has been released.

The tragedy has been fully explained. Mrs. Baker had deserted her husband and taken up with Shoemaker, and while the latter was in a hospital Howard appeared in the home. That Shoemaker's physical condition and brooding over the situation unbalanced him and the clearing up of the relations between the three plainly shows the motive for the killing. It was a repetition of the old story of two men and one woman.
