IMBLER FARMER HAS ACCIDENT

GEORGE MARSHALL, SQUEEZED
BETWEEN WAGON AND BARN.

Injuries While Quite Severe Are Not
Considered Dangerous.

(Imbler, Sept. 11.—(Special).—Geo. Marshall, a farmer residing a mile north of Imbler was the victim of a serious, though not dangerous, accident last Thursday. Mr. Marshall was standing between a wagon and a building and another wagon was close by. He spoke to the second team, intending for them to move forward, and the other horses started, catching him between the wagon and barn. As the team was pulling nearer to the barn, Mr. Marshall received several severe cuts and bruises before the wagon stopped. His head was cut in two or three places, besides injuries in the chest and back. Dr. Moore was summoned immediately. The injured man, though suffering considerably, is recovering and no serious results are anticipated.

PRINCETON PROFESSOR IN FIX

Trenton, N. J., Aug. 31.—Vice Chancellor Backes issued an order to-

day to Prof. Frank L. Critchlow of Princeton University to show cause why he should not be permanently restrained from entering the house now occupied by his wife at No. 132 Mercer Street.

Mrs. Critchlow asked for the order today, and a temporary one was granted. She says her husband deserted her two years ago, and that on Aug. 21 he broke into her home when she refused to allow him to enter.

Prof. Critchlow claims he owns the house, but his wife contends she bought it before her marriage in 1911, and that the only things the professor owns there are a few books and some clothing.
