## ADVICE GIVEN NEW STUDENTS

Corvallis, Or., Sept. 22.—Since it is more profitable to start a college career right than to get right after a wrong start, young men and women entering O. A. C. for the first time this year will be given the benefit of the counsel and advice of a specialist in the fundamentals of college life. E. B. Beatty has been appointed to act as special adviser of incoming freshmen and vocationalists.

This policy was devised by a committee appointed by President Kerr to consider the best means of counseling the incoming freshmen and vocational students. Prof. Beatty will act largely through organizations and the class officers with whom he will confer concerning the forms and purposes of organization and approve the constitution and by-laws. He will advise with the class officers of freshman and vocational students in all matters involving levies of class taxes and expenditure of money. The extent to which these organizations should participate in college activities will also be made subjects of counsel and advice.

It is expected that this policy will result in better adjustment of the college courses, more satisfactory progress in college work and in improved college life.

#### State to Survey Road.

Salem, Or., Sept. 22.—The state highway commission Tuesday voted \$1,500 to defray the cost of surveying a highway between Independence and Corvallis. Joseph Herschberger's offer of \$500 for the survey, if the commission would apportion \$1,500, was accepted.
