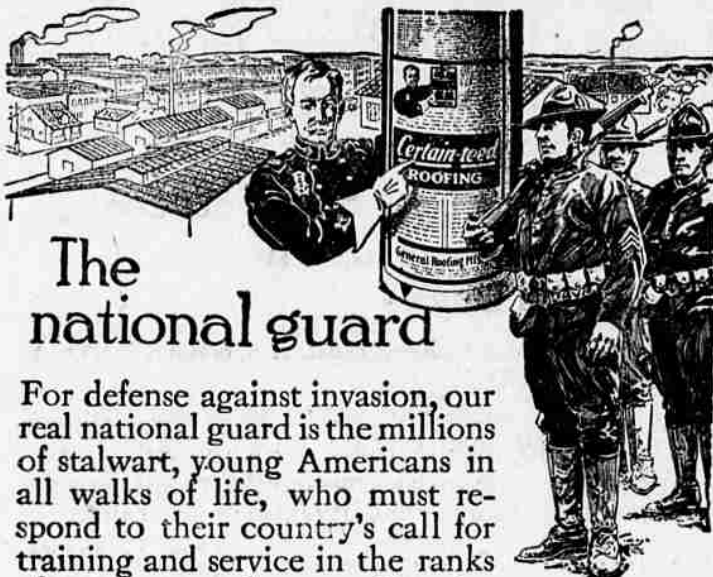

MARIAN IRELAND IS DEATH VICTIM

BRILLIANT MUSICAL CAREER COMES TO SUDDEN TERMINATION.

Former La Grande Girl Was Blooming Out as Portland Musician, When Death Came.

Miss Marian Ireland, 16-year-old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. James Ireland who live in Multnomah, a Portland suburb, died last week after a brief illness. Until about six or seven years ago, the Irelands made their home in La Grande and it was here that little Marian laid the foundation for what seemed certain to be a brilliant career in music. She attended Sacred Heart Academy in La Grande, as a child and there developed musical ability of a promising sort, and at the time of her death was a remarkably skilled violinist and musician generally. Her untimely death has plucked a sweet, loveable girl, one whose future in music was to all appearance remarkable. The bereaved parents have the whole-souled sympathy of their many friends in La Grande. Little Marian was always a pet of all who knew her, and as she grew older she lost none of her charm and likableness.

She is survived by her father and mother, and older sister Catherine, and her departure leaves an unfillable void in the otherwise happy Ireland family. Their little home out on the Multnomah hills has a sorrow which will never heal, and in the family bereavement, many La Grande people share.

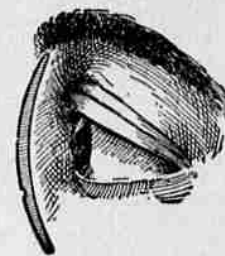
