NEW ARREST IN FAMOUS NICHOLS CASE MAY CAUSE RELEASE OF MAN SERVING LIFE TERM

The arrest of Arthur Waltonen at Ironwood, Mich., may cause the release of Onni Talas, a frail, young boy, who lies in a life imprisonment cell at Sing Sing, convicted of murder. Talas was convicted of the murder of Mrs. Elizabeth Nichols, wealthy New York woman, who was found dead in her apartments a year ago. Jewels valued at \$17,000 had been stripped from her body. Talas, her butler, was accused of the crime and convicted despite his assertion that Waltonen had entered the house and after binding and gagging him had committed the crime. He also stated that after the real criminal had escaped the police by torturing him, had coerced him into signing a confession. Friends of Talas expect the boy to
