For the first time since he scored such a marked success in support of Billie Burke in "Peggy," William H. Thompson, the dean of the American stage, will be seen in a Triangle feature, Wednesday and Thursday, when he is presented by Thomas H. Ince as Costar with Anna Lehr in "Civilization's Child." In the title part, Miss Lehr, as Berna, the immigrant girl, gives a most sympathetic interpretation of the "little barbarian."

Others in the cast are Jack Standing, as Nicolai Turgenev; Dorothy Dalton, as Ellen McManus; Clyde Benson, as Jacob Weil; J. P. Lockney, as Peter Saramoff; and J. Barney Sherry, as Judge Sims. The production was directed by Charles Giblyn.
