



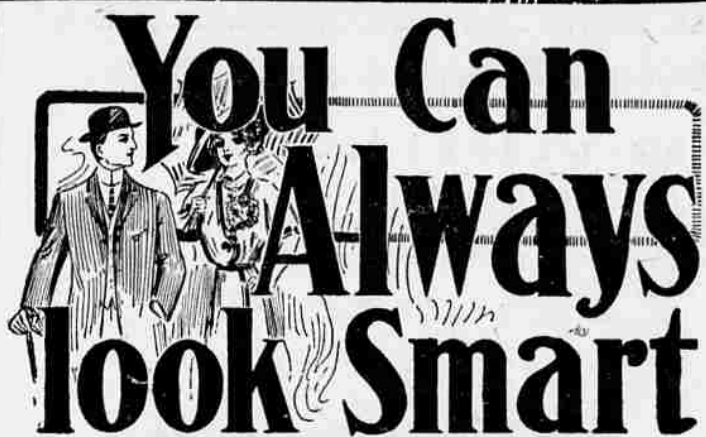

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SIMPLE THINGS A BIG HELP

UNCLE SAM TELLS HOW TO
ECONOMIZE TIME AND EF-
FORT IN HOMES.

Scrubbing Chariot But One of Many
Crude But Effective Household De-
vices Mentioned.

A number of labor-saving devices which will lessen the housewife's work may be constructed quickly and easily. Uncle Sam tells the Observer that the following contrivances actually being made and used by women county agents in the field and by the women who are working as demonstrators in connection with the extension work, south, States Relations Service, can be made on the farm during spare time:

Scrubbing Chariot

The "scrubbing chariot" consists of a comfortable padded frame on rollers which enable the housewives, in wiping the floors, to do the scrubbing and save a great many steps. This may be built at a very small cost; the material needed consisting of a three-fourths inch plank, 20 by 10 inches, 2-inch straps for the sides, which should be 8 1/2 inches long by 4 inches wide, and a front piece of the same material 20 inches long and 4 inches wide. An ordinary soap box can be used for this by cutting down the size to about 5 inches high and knocking out one side. The padding for the bottom of the chariot may be made of burlap. Tack this around the side of the chariot and place the whole thing on four rollers. Place a soap dish on one side and a little rack for the scrubbing brush on the opposite side. This contrivance it is estimated costs about 47 cents.

Combined China Closet, Serving Table

Another step-saving device made by the members of the demonstration club mentioned is a roller tray wagon. This convenience comprises a china closet, serving table, and roller tray all in one. This device was built by using a box 5 inches deep for the top and placing it on 4 wooden posts for legs. Dimensions: Top of table 31 1/2 inches long by 16 1/2 inches wide and 29 inches high, and serving compartment 5 inches deep. The top of the table is put on hinges and straps or small chains fastened to it to keep the top from falling back too far when opened. The bottom of the serving compartment is 5 inches below this top. Around the sides of this compartment are little screw hooks on which the cups may be hung. In the compartment, which may be lined with white oilcloth, is space for serving dishes for six. Below the serving compartment is a drawer which is divided in the center by a 1/2 inch strip. One side is used for the linen and one side for the silver. The side for silver is lined with blue outing flannel because this serves the same purpose and is cheaper than felt. A spool was cut into halves to make the knobs for the drawer and a pair of these knobs were placed on each side. The legs were square pieces of wood 1 1/2 inches square with rollers. Old rubber-tired wheels from toy wagons of discarded baby coaches may be used. This is an improvement because the tray rolls noiselessly. In some cases the legs from old tables can be used in place of hiving these made. At each end two brackets were placed so that the table could be pushed or pulled. When the soiled dishes were taken to the kitchen and washed they were placed in this serving compartment with one handlin' going, the lid placed down and the roller tray rolled into the dining room, with the dishes and silver ready for setting the table for the next meal. It is not necessary to put them away because they are out of dust when the top is down.

With a small doily and a vase of flowers this roller tray answers the purpose of a serving table and makes a very attractive piece of furniture.

Folding Ironing Board

Another step saver that may be added to the list is the folding ironing board and cover. This device, which is hinged to the wall, is always ready and in place. It may be hooked up against the wall when not in use. The leg is hinged to the board and falls flat when the board is lifted. With it down and in use, the leg is not in the way, and skirts may be ironed without any lifting or changing. The directions for making follow:

Length, 57 inches; rounded at free end. Width, attached end, 15 inches; free end, 10 1/2 inches. Leg, 58 1/2 inches to be changed to suit; height of board; attached to board 11 inches from free end.

Board to be attached by hinges to the wall 33 inches from the floor. For use by person above average height, the board should be higher, which will necessitate a longer leg. Board to be made of thoroughly seasoned wood 1 1/2 inches in thickness.

A Good Paying Crop

W. E. Parker, of Plainview, candidate for sheriff of Linn county on the Democratic ticket, has been making some records on his ranch in the way of crop yields this season. Some time ago he threshed vetch which went 40 bushels to the acre. Now he is harvesting his clover of which he has 12 acres. This clover is a German imported clover used for lawn purposes and sells on the market for 40 cents a pound. His output was 30 sacks of 150 pounds each, making a total of 4500 pounds and at 40 cents a pound he would receive \$1800, or \$150 per acre, which is a pretty good paying crop.

An industry now occupying the interest of many people of the valley is

the harvesting of the evergreen blackberry. From 1600 to 2000 crates are shipped daily from Gervais to the canneries. These berries grow wild in the fence corners and woods and slashings and are the source of a good revenue. Some of the farmers last year planted a few acres to experiment with under cultivation, and are so well pleased with the result that many acres will be planted before another year.—Gervais Star.

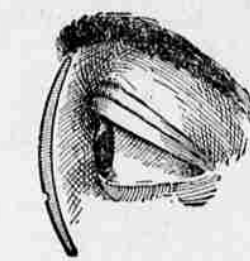
