The passengers and crew were landed in safety. The Triton was a wooden steamer of 48 tons gross register.

ARCADE

Laid in Two Countries is "Civilization's Child."

In the new Triangle-Ince feature play, "Civilization's Child," which will be shown at the Arcade Theater to-day and tomorrow, old Peter Saranoff, in the city of Kiev, Russia, decides that his little grand-niece Berna, who has been left an orphan up in the mountains, should be brought to civilization; but barely has his little bird arrived in Kiev when a massacre of Jews takes place, and Berna is left alone again.

Old Peter had planned to send her to America, to her uncle, and Berna goes to New York to the home of Jacob Weil, a sweatshop worker. Weil has risen to affluence through the favor of McManus, a political boss; and when McManus casts his eye upon pretty Berna, Weil has naught to do but give her up.

As McManus has done to many another maid, he ruins Berna and throws her to the street to live a life of shame. But as time goes on Berna meets Turgenev, a young Russian musician, who is struggling to get along; and they fall in love. They go to live together. And when the baby comes she persuades him to marry her.

In due course, and with Berna's unswerving aid, Turgenev rises to fame and position. There he meets the beloved daughter of McManus. Learning that divorce for Turgenev is all his daughter wants to complete her happiness, McManus, now an honored jurist, undertakes to secure it. With a man "planted" in her rooms, he secures the necessary evidence, and Turgenev is freed. When Berna tries to fight the case in court she finds the presiding judge is McManus; and for her effort she is sent to "the island," while her baby is placed in a home with persons alleged to be better fitted to bring it up.

HORSE RAISING IS PROFITABLE.

Chicago, Sept. 27.—The European war has caused such a scarcity of horses in the United States that farmers who raise the adaptable Belgian, whose weight ranges from 1200 to 1500 pounds making it an excellent cavalry or police mount, are putting a high price on the animals, which at the present time is being accepted by the horse dealer. While thousands of Percherons and Belgians, weighing from 1500 to 1800 pounds are at present employed in drawing cannon and ammunition wagons on the battlefields, they are not so commonly used here as the lighter animal. A cross between Percheron stock and the American horses makes an almost ideal general purpose animal, and a well matched team will bring from

\$500 to \$600, where formerly a team could be purchased at \$200 to \$300. There is no importation of horses at this time and therefore, American farmers are short of the adaptable Belgians, which in part accounts for the increased value.

WANT STRICT DIVORCE LAWS.

Ohio Methodists Urge Governor and Legislature to Act. Zanesville, O., Sept. 27.—Resolutions urging the governor and state legislature to enact more stringent divorce laws were to be adopted by more than 500 ministers and laymen of the Ohio Methodist conference in annual session here today, which will continue through Saturday. The West Ohio Methodist conference meeting at Lima two weeks ago adopted a similar resolution. A resolution favoring the constitutional amendment for national prohibition also will be adopted.

Data on Sumpter Valley Roads.

Baker, Sept. 26.—Headed by Chief Engineer Norton, government surveyors and draftsmen left this morning to be gone for the next week securing data along the line of the Sumpter Valley railroad, to be used as the basis of estimates of the value of the road, ordered by the Interstate Commerce commission. The work is going on all over the country, and previous to arriving in Baker, the party now quartered here was engaged in similar operations on the line of the O. W. R. & N. Co., between here and Huntington.
