FAIR ATTRACTS BIG EXHIBITS

Enterprise, Sept. 27.—Special.—Better weather prevailed at the Wallowa county fair today and great crowds were out in anticipation of seeing the fun and being entertained with fine exhibits and good horse racing.

Ample room has been given the four leading schools of the county—Joseph Enterprise, Lostine and Wallowa. Classes from the schools are giving demonstrations of their daily work and it is attracting much attention. The manual training classes are making furniture, the domestic science classes are cooking and the commercial classes doing actual business work.

The stockhorns and poultry houses are well filled. Three fine herds of Hereford cattle are shown by C. A. Hunter and Peter McDonald, of Wallowa, and W. C. Dorrance, of Enterprise. An excellent showing is also made in Jerseys, Holsteins and Durhams, besides a few from other herds.

A number of horses are exhibited by the best horsebreeders, and more are expected. Races and contests are going on daily, and there will be a number of prizes given out by tomorrow night, as the judging is to begin Wednesday morning.

The whole fair will be at its best Thursday and Friday. Stock parades are given each morning. Amusements are plentiful. A carnival troop will show for the whole week on the grounds. The residents of Enterprise are proving themselves fine hosts, as every available means is taken to accommodate the visitors on the grounds. There are dining-rooms and lunch counters, and the residents are throwing open their homes to the crowd.

The fair has been well attended from the opening, but a much larger crowd is expected for the last part of the week. The Enterprise schools are to close at noon of each day and the stores will close each afternoon. Weather conditions are the only drawback to the fair, as it has been threatening, but today was fine.

HONOR LATE DR. A. G. LANE

Freemont Presbyterian Church Establishes Lasting Remembrance

The memory of the late Dr. A. G. Lane, of the La Grande Presbyterian church, has been signalled honored at his former church in Freemont, Ohio. The Freemont (Ohio) Daily Press has this to say of the event in memorial to the late La Grande pastor:

"A handsome new communion table was placed in the First Presbyterian church Wednesday. The table is a memorial to the late Dr. A. G. Lane, who was pastor of the First church for twelve years and who passed beyond two years ago. The donors of the beautiful table were a group of the church members who were associated with Dr. Lane and knew him well during his pastorate here. The table is a home product, having been made by Gropp & Arndt and it is of solid mahogany to match the pulpit and chair. In the center is a small silver plate on which is inscribed: 'In loving memory of Rev. A. G. Lane, D. D., and the dates of his Fremont pastorate, 1893 to 1915. The beautiful new table will be used for the first time at the communion services in First church Sunday, October first.'

Pittsburgh Clambake Has Side of \$4,500 Chickens

Pittsburgh, Sept. 27.—The Stewards Club celebrated today with a Rhode Island Clambake at Keystone Park, following the election of Frank A. Knapp, of this city, as president of the International Stewards Association and selection of this city for the 1917 convention.

On the bill of fare today were 4,500 lobsters, 4,500 chickens, 4,500 seabass, 40,000 clams, 8,000 crabs, 15,000 ears of corn, 30,000 potatoes and many extras. About 5,000 men were to participate in the celebration—and no women. William F. Hammel, chief executive of the Pittsburgh club, was in charge.
