Clover Seed Pays Well.

Perry Parker, of the Plainview district, Linn county, has just finished the hulling and marketing of his clover seed crop for this year, and although he had but about half a crop he got 131 sacks of 180 pounds each, making a total of 23,580 pounds, which he sold for 15 cents a pound, netting him \$3537. As a by-crop says the Lebanon Criterion, it isn't often that that amount can be gathered in, but since it has become possible to grow clover in the Willamette valley such returns are by no means rare.
