slaughter this week, while others say that Chinns were quite numerous, but young. All agree that the duck shooting is going to be skimpy this year. A great number joined in the hunt.

Comparatively little complaint has been brought in about early shooting yesterday, hunters seemingly heeding Uncle Sam's warning to not shoot ducks before sunrise. Pheasants and other game birds may be shot a half hour before sunrise.

For the month of October the following table gives accurate sunrise and sunset, the computations being based on 120th meridian time at Baker, and as the difference in time between Baker and La Grande is less than two minutes Baker time is taken as standard:

President's Responsibility For Extravagance.

Washington, Oct. 1.—The Republican Publicity Association, through its President, Hon. Jonathon Bourns, Jr., today gave out the following statement at its Washington Headquarters:

"The manifest willingness of Democratic campaign managers to let Congress bear the blame for extravagance while President Wilson takes credit for all alleged accomplishments, should not deceive any American voter.

"Though Congress should and must bear its share of responsibility for appropriations unprecedently large, yet the fact should not be forgotten, as pointed out by Congressman Fitzgerald, Democratic Chairman of the House Appropriations Committee in 1915, that Congress appropriated far less than the executive departments asked.

"Estimates and recommendations are made by members of a cabinet appointed by the president and under his immediate control. Moreover, each member of the cabinet has supervision of the expenditures in the department of which he is head. Nearly all appropriations are made for 'not exceeding' the specified amount, and any cabinet member desiring to economize can do so in most instances.

"It is important to keep in mind, therefore, that Congress appropriated less than President Wilson's cabinet asked, and then gave the executive departments discretion to expend less than was appropriated.

"Furthermore, if President Wilson had desired that the economy pledge of the Baltimore platform be kept, could have so declared in one of his numerous public addresses to Congress

or on the occasion of some of his personal visits to the capitol to hold secret conference with Democratic leaders.

"Upon him, therefore, rests at least

equal responsibility with the Democratic Congress for the extravagance and wastefulness which have added to the burden and annoyance of 'emergency taxation'."
