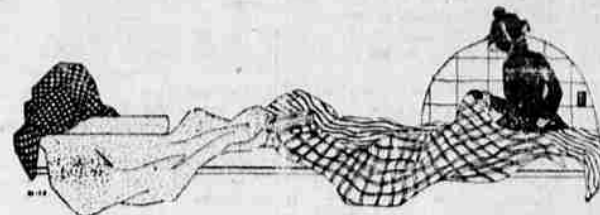

VIGILANCE BAND FORMED

Citizens Will Aid The Police To Rid Streets Of Loafers

Philadelphia, Oct. 1.—Police raids and the organization of citizen "vigilance committees" are being used to break up corner lounging in several sections of this city.

One of these bodies of "vigilantes" was organized in a drug store at Moore street and Passayunk avenue yesterday. The committee represents the business men of the section.

Several small hold-ups are being traced to corner loafers, it is said, and while the police are busy with the cases the vigilantes are going to take up their duties. There are now more than 500 quarantines in effect and this has cut deeply into the police force in every station.

Two police raids have cleared the situation. In one raid in the tenderloin 36 loungers were nabbed, and another raid on the square at Twelfth and Wharton streets brought 21 men, each of whose job was doing nothing.

Drunken brawls and annoyances to women have aroused the business men in other sections of the city to appeal to the police to break up gangs that loaf on busy corners. The police answered with the two raids.

MAN IN CREVASSE SUICIDE

Alaskan, Fearing Death By Freezing Cuts Arteries

Seward, Alaska, October 1.—While crossing the Portage Glacier from Turnagain Arm to Portage Bay, in company with C. D. Eaton, a resident of Hope, Bert Foreman fell into a crevasse and alighted in water out of sight of Eaton, who had become separated a short distance from his companion on account of a snow storm. Eaton began a search on hearing Foreman's cries for help. He told Foreman that he would enter the crevasse lower down and rescue him. While Eaton was gone, Foreman became panic stricken and opened the arteries in his left wrist. Eaton said he feared he would freeze to death and chose an easier way to die. The body was carried out of Mile 68 of the United States Railroad and will be brought here. Foreman's wife committed suicide by shooting in Anchorage last week because of despondency.
