Senator Norris Here on Thursday

One of the Pioneer Progressives Will Speak for Hughes in La Grande Meeting This Week.

Senator George W. Norris of Nebraska who will speak at the big Hughes rally here on Thursday, October 12, is one of the leading progressive Republicans of the country of the Beveridge, Borah, Hadley type. He was floor leader for the "Insurgents" in the famous "Rules Fight" in the House of Representatives in 1910.

Born in Ohio he spent his early life on a farm. His father died when he was a boy and as his only brother was killed in the Civil War he was compelled to work out among neighboring farmers during the summer and get his "book learning" at the district school winters. He afterwards worked his way through Baldwin University at Berea, Ohio and Valparaiso university, Indiana. Was admitted to

the bar in 1883 and moved to Nebraska in 1885. Afterwards prosecuting attorney three terms, district judge, and member of congress 58th, 59th, 60th, 61st and 62nd congresses. He was nominated for the senate in popular primary in 1912 by the Republicans and endorsed by the Progressives and elected over Ashton C. Sheelenger by a plurality of about fifteen thousand votes.

Stray Shots Hit Pedestrian's Face

Hunter Fires at Bird, and James Monnier, Barber, Out for a Walk Struck in the Face—Eye Escapes.

James Monnier, a barber in the Joe Kelley shop on Adams avenue was hit in the face yesterday by a lone shot from a shotgun. Two deep trenches, one in the bridge of his nose, and the other on the cheek bone where the shot ricocheted after landing on the nostril bones, remain today to tell the story of his escape. Mr. Monnier and a group of friends had been strolling on East Adams yesterday afternoon and went to the rock crusher on the hillside and during the course of their walk, a bird flew up from the commons below. A hunter farther down towards the city, cut loose with an automatic and a stray shot came Mr. Monnier's way. The gashes were deep enough to leave a smarting sting and two well-defined sores today mark the course of the shot. The wounds are less than an inch below the eye, indicating how near the man came to suffering serious injuries.

BIG BEAR IS HUNTING PRIZE

Pat Foley and Bert Hughes went up in the Beaver creek country to hunt big game and were rewarded with the capture of a big, brown bear. Having first got a line of the bear's rendezvous they set a trap and the bear was caught. It was their intention to bring it home alive, but on the way down the bear became very refractory and chewed ropes, straps and chains and finally got away from them altogether. The only recourse left was to shoot the animal which they did and got back home with him anyway. The bear weighs about 300 pounds.

GRANGE ACCEPTS RESOLUTION Single Tax Amendment Opposed By Blue Mountain Grange

Blue Mountain Grange 345, in regular session unanimously endorsed the following resolution, adopted by the Multnomah County Pomona Grange: "Whereas the single tax amendment has been before the public for a number of years, under different titles and disguises, and has been overwhelmingly defeated at the polls, and

"Whereas, The continual submission of this measure by initiative is working great harm to the initiative and referendum system of legislation by endangering its future usefulness and popularity; Therefore, be it

"Resolved, By Multnomah District Pomona grange in regular session assembled, that we denounce in unequivocal terms, the measure known as the "Full Rental Value Land Tax and Home Makers' Loan Fund Amendment" as confiscatory, unwarranted and vicious.

"Whereas, the so-called People's Land and Loan Law, if adopted by popular vote in November, would become part of the constitution of Oregon, and

"Whereas, it would make all farm owners and home owners mere tenants of the state, possessed of empty titles and burdened with the obligation of paying each year the full rental value of their homes and lands into the public treasury, and

"Whereas, by its provisions for loaning \$1500 cash without interest

MONKEY FLESH IS MAN'S DIET

Starving Remittance Man Lives In Primitive Style

Managua, Nicaragua, Oct. 9.—To proud to beg, and finding himself on the verge of starvation because of the impoverishment of his noble family in Europe, Count Franz Lazarini, a remittance man well known in Central America, went to a jungle near here and kept himself alive for five months by eating monkey flesh, and roots and berries.

A party of United States marines while on a big game hunting expedition discovered the titled foreigner and brought him back to the capital. The count, half starved and nearly mad because of the privations he had suffered, fought his rescuers and begged them to let him remain in the jungle. The marines overpowered him however, and are now attempting to nurse him back to health and reason at their commodious barracks in the American legation.

Bids Opened for Government Timber. Portland, Oct. 7.—Bids were opened Saturday by the District Forester, Portland, for the sale of 124,000,000 feet of timber on the Middle Fork John Day River, Whitman National Forest. The Pacific States Timber Investment company, of which Mr. Frank B. Mitchell of Baker, Oregon, is President, was the highest bidder.

The timber involved in the sale is 92 per cent yellow pine, and is situated in T. 10 S., R. 34 and 35 E., and T. 11 S., R. 33 and 34 E., W. M., and covers an approximate area of 14,600 acres. The prices bid by the company are \$2.91 per M for the pine and 75 cents per M for the other species.
