bowls and gives voice to some radical opinions on conscription or politics. Floyd is a radical, too, but just the other way. Of course he can't stand by and hear his firmest convictions run into the ground, so he wallops Bill on the nose. Friends intervene and the belligerents draw on liberal night-caps before winding their way home. The same incident has been repeated in perhaps a score of places. Sunday morning they meet and fight to a knockout—in the open, whatever the weather, with no ropes, no gloves and only the grass for their mat. If Bill wins he is undoubtedly right about conscription or whatever it was he was expounding. Jimmy Wilde, the knockout champion, came from the Rhonda valley and learned his fighting up in the hills. The miners are proud of Jimmy and back him to the limit. He, in turn has done his part by slumberizing a lot of good fighters from flyweights to feathers. Yes, Freddie Welsh comes from Rhonda, too, but the miners only mumble the fact when they mention it at all. Freddie is popular in his old home town with the inverse popularity of a German butcher.

Chile's High Birth and Death Rate.

If due attention were given to the most ordinary sanitary principles and hygiene the death rate in the country would be extremely low in comparison with that of most countries in South America. In physique, the Chileans are the most sturdy race on the continent. Living by the seashore or mostly in the open air in the rural districts, a fine, hardy manhood has been developed. The highest death rate is in the towns and cities, where dwelling houses lack the most elementary appliances of sanitation. Smallpox and typhoid are very prevalent, and some years fearful epidemics break out. Pneumonia and tuberculosis are also prevalent. But Chile's high death rate is mainly accounted for by the heavy infantile mortality from contagious diseases. The birth record of Chile is one of the highest in the world, but the mean rate of increase in population by excess of births over deaths reduces it to one of the lowest in the world. Thus one of the most healthful countries in the world reduces its increase to a minimum through ignorance, carelessness in the treatment of children, and the bad sanitary conditions in the dwellings of the working classes. A great and beneficent work can be done through evangelical missions in Chile by the appointment of a well-trained staff of deaconesses, with a fair elementary knowledge of sanitation. A work like this would open a door for the Gospel.—The Christian Herald.

Half Section at Helix Sold.

Helix, Ore., Oct. 9.—John Tompkins sold to Ed Potts, Thursday, one-half section of land, 4 1-2 miles northeast of Helix for \$37,000. Mr. Tompkins will vacate immediately and will spend the winter in California. In connection with the purchase, Mr. Potts leased of Mrs. Wm. Tompkins 500 acres for 5 years.

Hero is Nephew of Chief Joseph.

Nez Perce, Idaho, Oct. 4.—Jackson Sundown, the full-blooded Nez Perce Indian who made all the pate-faced riders at Pendleton bite the dust when he won the broncho-riding championship, has returned to his home at Nez Perce, with his \$500 prize money and \$350 prize saddle. While making his successful ride scores of Indians, in full war paint and gaudy regalia, looked on in fierce wrath the whites cheered loudly for the conquering hero.

Sundown is a typical Indian. A P. Proctor, a New York sculptor, has been using him all summer as a model for bronze Indian busts. He is a nephew of Chief Joseph, the famous Nez Perce warrior. He has been fighting for the championship for the last four years.

Electric Train in Ditch.

Tacoma, Wash., Oct. 4.—Between 20 and 30 persons were injured, three of them seriously, when the Tacoma-Seattle Limited on the Puget Sound Electric company line run into an open switch and went into the ditch at Willows junction, one mile east of the city late yesterday afternoon.

Power Site Opened to Entry.

Department of the Interior, U. S. Land Office La Grande, Oregon, September 26, 1916.

The commissioner of the General Land Office, on September 19th, 1916, advised this office that Power sight Reserve No. 170 by Executive Order dated September 5th, 1916, had been revoked so far as it applied to the following described land:

- SE1-4 SW11-4, E1-2 SE1-4, SW1-4 SE1-4 Sec. 11, NW1-4 NE1-4, NW 1-4 and NW1-4 SW1-4, Sec. 12, N1-2 NE1-4, and E1-2 NW1-4, Sec. 14, Tp. 3 N., R. 40 E. W. M., also Lot 1, 2, and 4, Sec. 30 and Lot 1, Sec. 31, Tp. 4 N., R. 41 E., W. M.

All of the above described land which has not otherwise been reserved, withdrawn, or appropriated, will under the law applicable thereto and the regulations of the department thereunder, become subject to settlement at 9 o'clock a. m., on October 23rd, 1916, and to entry, filing or selection at 9 o'clock, a. m., November 22nd, 1916, at the U. S. Land Office, in La Grande, Oregon.

Warning is hereby expressly given that no person will be permitted to gain or exercise any right whatever under any settlement begun prior to the date of settlement fixed herein and subsequent to the restoration of the tracts involved, and all such settlement or occupancy is forbidden and those settling in violation hereof are liable to be ejected.

Intending settlers are also warned to ascertain the status of the land by inquiry at this office before making settlement thereon. Persons having valid subsisting rights initiated prior to the withdrawal, and who have maintained such rights, will be allowed to make entry to filing in accordance with existing laws and regulations.
