SECTIONALISM SPEECH THEMES
President Wilson Deplores What He Terms "Talking Through Hats"
Indianapolis, Oct. 13.—(Special).—President Wilson yesterday replied to the Republican charge that the Democratic party is a sectional party with the statement that "any man who revives the issue of sectionalism in this country is unworthy of the confidence of the nation."
Bordering on the political, the president declared "Talking through the hat ought to be a dead industry. Every man who speaks in public should have as a motto, 'put up or shut up.'"
In a brief luncheon speech, the president said, smilingly, that the Republicans are as good Americans as he was. "After all, we have a common object. The quarrel for the

next three or four weeks is now to realize what we all wish to accomplish."

Mr. Jester An Honest Man.
Portland papers ran long stories last night and today about Chas. D. Jester, of La Grande, who is in Portland as organizer for the Modern Woodmen. Mr. Jester and a friend saw a pedestrian drop a roll of bills and checks, amounting all told to \$404, and try as the two might, they couldn't locate the fellow in the congested traffic. They took the money to the police station and in due time the owner, a Portland merchant, was located. There was nearly \$300 in currency which many a man would have gone 50-50 with, no doubt, but the La Grande man was an honest man.

Idaho Highway Is Projected.
Lewiston, Ida., Oct. 13.—(Special).—The north and south Idaho state highway association yesterday adopt-

ed a resolution urging the legislature to appropriate \$130,000 toward a state highway from Weiser in southern Idaho, through the Salmon river country to northern Idaho, supplementing other funds and making available over \$400,000 for the north and south road during the next three years. The new highway would connect with the Washington state highway system at Lewiston.
