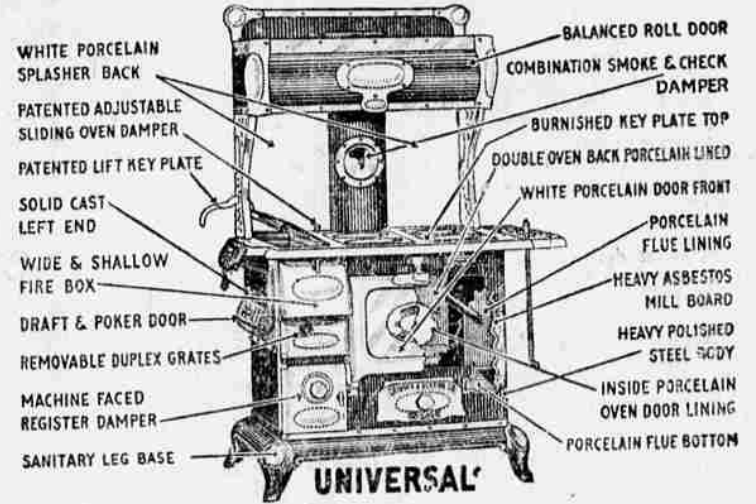

BAD OCEAN TRIP RECALLED.

Rev. Upton H. Gibbs Sailed From Glasgow 35 Years Ago Today. Thirty-five years ago today Rev. Upton H. Gibbs, rector of St. Peter's and dean of the ministerial fraternity of this city, set sail from Glasgow for America. The date was recalled today by Mr. Gibbs in conversation over rough seas. On the day his ship put out to sea, great numbers of boats were lost off the coast of Ireland, and the trip was delayed by very heavy storms. Incidentally he landed in Iowa in due course of time, and there encountered the famous mud year in that state when grain was unthreshable, horses dying of mud fever, and conditions generally deplorable. Mr. Gibbs admitted today that upon that occasion he much longed for old England again.

PARTY ARGUMENTS IN BRIEF

DEMOCRATIC CATALOGUE OF PRESIDENT WILSON'S ENEMIES COMPILED FOR NATIONAL COMMITTEE.

 New York, Oct. 13.—(United Press)—Never was anyone so fortunate in his enemies as President Wilson. The forces that fight him emphasize his achievements and accentuate the issues more strongly than all the words that could be used. Against him is Wall street, eager to repeal the Federal reserve act that has released credit and forbidden usury; the employers who made money out of child labor; the Shipping trust, still dreaming of subsidies and furious against the Seamen's law that has lifted the sailor out of slavery; Financial Imperialism, hopeful of the time when it may use the army and the navy as collection agencies; the Armor Plate trust and the Powder Trust, whipped out of their extortions by government manufacture; the tariff swine, homesick for the Payne-Aldrich law upon which they built their monopolies; the labor crushers who hate the provision in the Clayton law that stopped the abuse of the writ of injunction and the imprisonment of men without trial by jury; the reactionaries who fought the appointment of Brandeis to the supreme bench because they feared his honesty and progressivism.
 The alien conspirators, impudently demanding that a president be elected who will take his foreign policies from Berlin or London; Shylocks resentful of the Rural Credits law, and all the host of grafters who have been divorced from the good old trough at which they fed for so long a time.
 Not a monopolist, not a concessionaire, not a "hyphen," not a Tory nor a reactionary is missing from the roll of Woodrow Wilson's enemies. All of them are for Hughes, pouring their millions into his campaign fund, and supporting him with mad enthusiasm in those newspapers and magazines that they own, and in that portion of the foreign language press that they have subsidized.
 Never was choice so plain. On one side a President who has fought for the people and for America; on the other side every sinister force that has been poisoning the wells of democracy, every corrupt influence that has been taking the teeth out of the Declaration of Independence.

REPUBLICAN WORDS CONCERNING DEMOCRATIC APPOINTMENTS SPOKEN BY THE REPUBLICAN COMMITTEE.

 New York, Oct. 13.—(United Press)—Is it not small of Governor Hughes to devote so much time to attacking the Wilson administration because of its betrayal of civil service reform? Of what general interest is it that the Democrats have created a few more offices and appointed "deserving Democrats" to places formerly filled by Republicans.
 Betrayal of civil service reform means waste of the people's money. Is that a small matter? Civil service reform means appointing and keeping employed competent men. The appointment of men merely because they are "deserving Democrats" means, in practice, the appointment of incompetent men, just as does the replacing of competent Democrats with inexperienced Republicans chosen simply because of their service to the party. The Wilson administration has created not "a few," but thousands of needless, useless offices, and has filled these places and those of thousands of experienced men with incompetent. Of course, it generally takes three incompetents, or more, to do the same work that was performed by two trained and experienced men.
 When it becomes necessary to tax every man who runs a little theatre, according to its seating capacity, to impose taxes on every billiard and pool table, to add taxes to the expenses of every farmer and businessman who has to borrow money to conduct his business, is it not of importance whether the expenses of the Government are unnecessarily increased by using its funds to reward fellow political workers, instead of conducting the Government's business economically with men who can and will give value received for the wages they draw?
 What would you think of the manager of a creamery who, immediately he was appointed, let out half the competent, experienced men and put in their places his sons and nephews and friends, putting two of them on the payroll for every one let out? That is what the Wilson administration has been doing and that is what Governor Hughes promises he will not do. That is what has, in large part, made it necessary for the Democrats to impose various and onerous special

taxes. No one objects to a man taking care of his friends, but he should not do it at the expense of other people. The Democratic administration has taken excellent care of its friends, but it has done it at the expense of all the people.
