

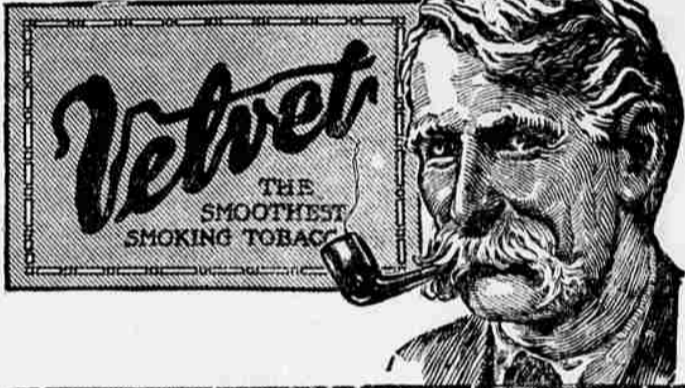

La Grande-made flour advanced 20 cents a barrel today, the rise following a few days in the wake of foreign-made flour increases early in the week.
