Mrs. Sturrrer has returned from a 50-days' working with a threshing machine.

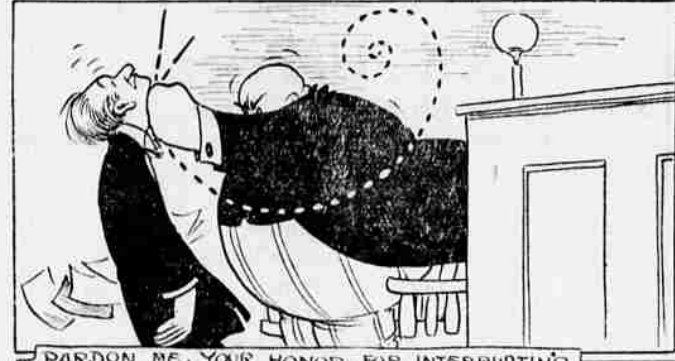
Mrs. E. B. Grinn came down from the Grande Ronde valley to look after his interests and to rent his ranch here to N. Mason of Palmer Junction.
