"LET'S MAKE UP"

"Rolling Stones," a Famous Players Production at Arcade Tuesday. It is probably true that the rolling stone gathers no moss—but as Buck Ryder so sagely remarked to Dave Falton—"Who wants to gather moss?" And they are the boys who ought to know all about the subject for they are the "Rolling Stones" in the Famous Players Film company's adaptation of Edgar Selwyn's celebrated play of that name in which the two great screen favorites, Owen Moore and Marguerite Courtot, are co-starring.

"Rolling Stones," by the way, marks the first appearance of pretty little Marguerite Courtot in a Famous Players production as she was one of the Famous Players-Lasky corporation. She is unquestionably one of the most popular ingenues on the screen and has been a shining screen light for the last four years. The play marks Owen Moore's second stellar role for the Famous Players since rejoining that company, as he recently co-starred with Hazel Dawn in an adaptation of Roi Cooper Megrue's celebrated stage success, "Under Cover."

"Rolling Stones" was selected as an especially adaptable play because there is so much action in the story and because the many complications of the plot are so readily evolved on the screen. When the play was produced on the stage it was declared by the metropolitan critics to be one of the most delightful combinations of laughs and thrills which has been seen for many a season. In its motion picture form, produced under the clever direction of Del Henderson, the play, which is the Paramount attraction at the Arcade Tuesday is even more amusing and thrilling.

Among those who appear in support of the stars are: Denman Maye, Alan Hale and Ida Fitzhugh.
