"THE HONORABLE FRIEND"
Five-Part Lasky-Paramount Drama
Features Sessue Hayakawa. Reviewed by George W. Graves in Motography.

In this drama by Elizabeth McGaffey we have a novel cast headed by Sessue Hayakawa, the finished Japanese actor, who is given ample scope to exercise his dramatic ability as well as his muscular strength. It is safe to say that those who will see this picture will come at least to one conclusion—that Mr. Hayakawa is a top-notch, forceful actor, eminently suited to motion picture work.

Playing opposite him is the demure Tsuri Aoki, whose glistening coiffure is quite a feature of the picture. Her acting is refined and distinctive. Two other Japanese, G. Kino and M. Matsumoto, complete the cast's foreign talent, while Raymond Hatton in the heavy character part instills the proper emotions in his audience. This picture will be at the Arcade today and tomorrow.

The story deals with the plotting of a wealthy, unscrupulous Japanese, Yayosho, who, realizing that his face will afford meager inducement to bring the beautiful Toki-Ye across from Japan, uses the photo of his handsome gardener, Makino, to get her into his power in America, the understanding between him and Makino being that the latter is to have the girl for his wife.

Toki-Ye and Makino are really married legally upon the former's arrival in this country, although Kayosho makes them think later that the ceremony has not been genuine. Toki-Ye is the niece of Goto, Kayosho's business manager, and her presence in America is carefully kept secret from Goto. The latter, for reasons of blood and tradition, incohered at his employer's retraction of his long-promised consent to marry his (Goto's) daughter,

kills Kayosho, but the spectator is lead to believe that Makino is the murderer. In the process of a third degree examination Goto confesses his guilt, Makino is set free and the lovers enter the land of uninvaded bliss.

EGGS UP TO FIFTY CENTS

ANOTHER WEEK OF RISING FLOUR PRICES INDICATED BY EARLY INCREASES

Potatoes Bring \$2.50 by the Hundred and Three Cents Retailed Out in Small Parcels.

It requires an even "four-bits" this week to buy a dozen eggs. All of which substantiates the guesses that "six-bit" eggs for Christmas will be a certainty.

The week opens with a bullish attitude still prevalent in the flour market. Washington brands such as Snowdrift and Upper Crust went up five cents a sack this morning, presaging further increases by other brands. Wholesalers and retailers are advised that further increases is likely.

The potato market is more uncertain than ever. By the central retailers get \$2.50 now and retailing in small lots obtain 3 cents.

Prize for Apple Packers.

Spokane, Wash., Oct. 28.—(Special)—In what kind of package is the northwestern apple to be marketed in the future?

Orchard men and marketing experts have been debating that question for a long time, and a definite step toward its solution is to be taken at the ninth National Apple show, which will be held in Spokane November 20 to 25. A special contest for new containers is announced for the apple show, and a gold medal is to be awarded to the winner.

This competition will be open to receive entries of cartons and small boxes designed to sell extra fancy fruit to the eastern trade, and will include also the extra large boxes, small barrels and other containers suggested for the purpose of moving the lower grades of fruit to nearby markets.

This award is to be made because of the growing feeling in some of the districts that an even more fancy package will have to be offered for some of the extra-fancy fruit and that a cheap container must be provided for nearby markets in order to cheapen the cost of packing.

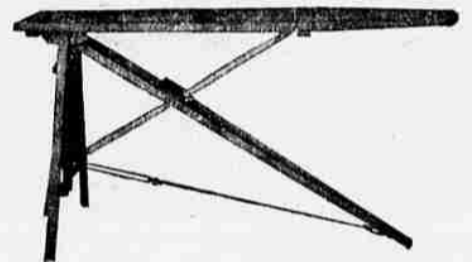

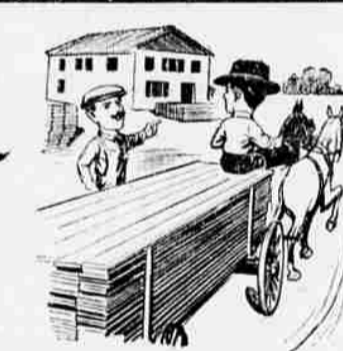
