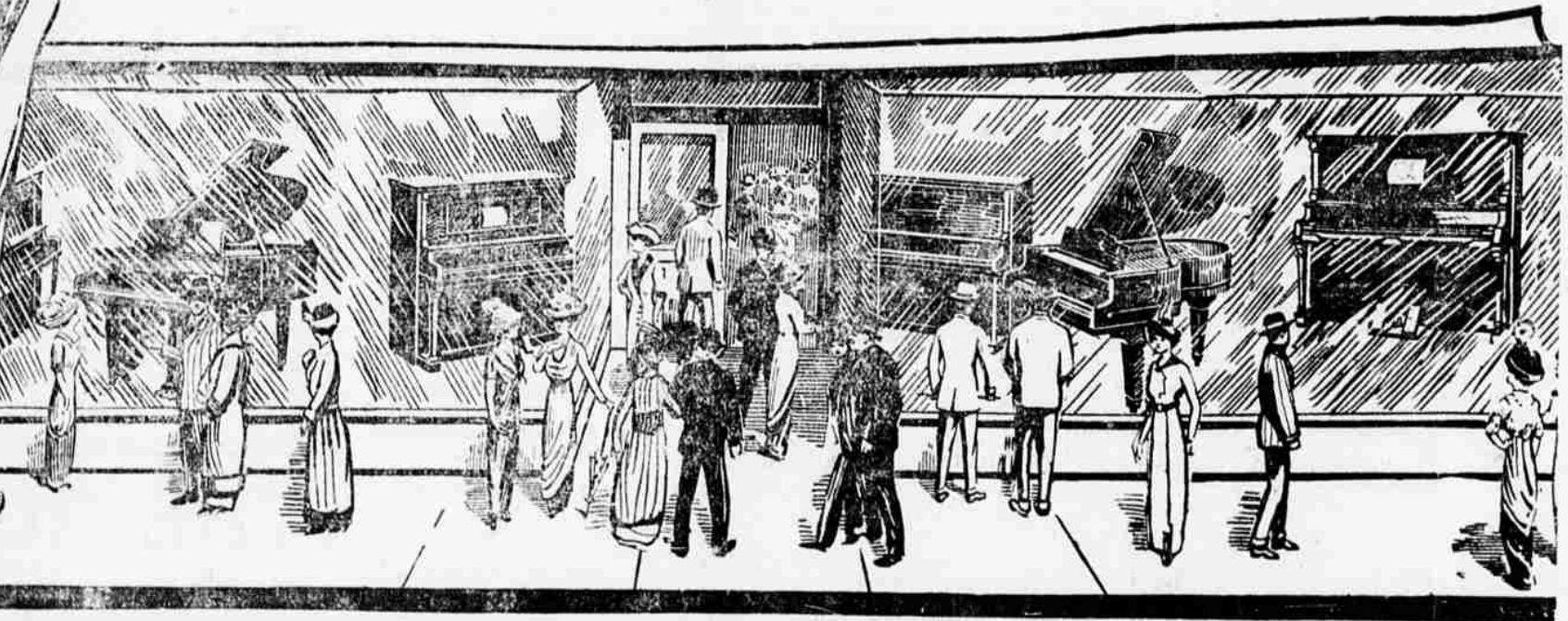

Nation's Crop Of Wheat Under 1915

Washington, D. C., Nov. 10.—(Special)—A summary of preliminary estimates of crop production for the State of Oregon and for the United States, as compiled by the Bureau of Crop Estimates (and transmitted through the Weather Bureau), U. S. Department of Agriculture, is as follows:

Wheat.
Oregon: October estimate, 17,457,000 bushels; production last year (final estimate), 20,025,000 bushels.
United States: October estimate, 607,557,000 bushels; production last year (final estimate), 1,011,505,000 bushels.

Oats.
Oregon: October estimate, 17,184,000 bushels; production last year (final estimate), 16,060,000 bushels.
United States: October estimate, 1,229,182,000 bushels; production last year (final estimate), 1,540,362,000 bushels.

Barley.
Oregon: October estimate, 4,966,000

bushels; production last year (final estimate), 4,680,000 bushels.
United States: October estimate, 183,536,000 bushels; production last year (final estimate), 237,009,000 bushels.

Potatoes.
Oregon: Estimate this year, 7,000,000 bushels; production last year (final estimate), 5,520,000 bushels.
United States: Estimate this year, 289,000,000 bushels; production last year (final estimate), 359,103,000 bushels.

Hay.
Oregon: September estimate, 1,973,000 tons; production last year (final estimate), 1,870,000 tons.
United States: September estimate, 86,155,000 tons; production last year (final estimate), 85,225,000 tons.

Apples.
Oregon: Estimate this year, 1,280,000 barrels; production last year (final estimate), 1,043,000 barrels.
United States: Estimate this year, 67,700,000 barrels; production last year (final estimate), 76,670,000 barrels.

Prices.
The first price given below is the average on November 1 this year, and the second, the average on November

1 last year.
Oregon: Wheat, 130 and 84 cents per bushel. Corn, 76 and 80. Oats, 43 and 36. Potatoes, 81 and 52. Hay, \$10.00 and \$8.70 per ton. Eggs, 37 and 32 cents per dozen.
United States: Wheat 158.0 and 95.1 cents per bushel. Corn, 85.0 and 61.9 cents. Oats, 49.0 and 34.9 cents. Potatoes, 136.0 and 60.9 cents. Hay, \$10.68 and \$10.83 per ton. Eggs, 32.0 and 26.3 cents per dozen. Cotton, 18.0 and 11.6 cents per pound.
