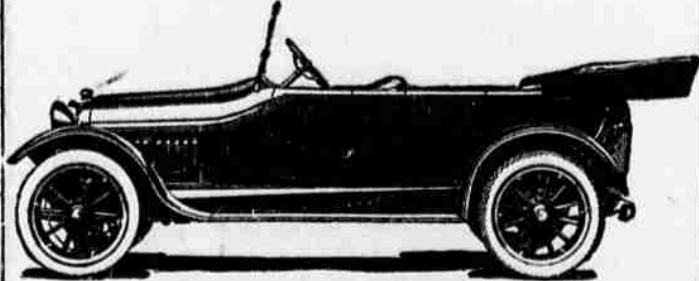

Apple Syrup Good Way to Utilize Cull Apples

Department of Agriculture
Furnishes Method Of Utilizing
Waste Products of The Orchard.

It may not be practical for the average fruit farmer to make apple syrup as a commercial proposition, but during seasons when there are a large number of culls and windfalls, or when markets are glutted, it is a matter of business economy to utilize by-products, and the making of apple syrup for the family's use is quite worth while. The following method for making apple syrup is furnished by H. C. Gore, of the bureau of chemistry of the department of agriculture.

Wash apples, remove all decayed and worm-eaten spots, and press out juice as usual for cider making. Be sure the juice does not ferment or "work" as only sweet cider should be used for syrup making. The sterilizing, reducing vat, or kettle, should be a third larger than required to hold contents.

Add five ounces of powdered calcium carbonate to seven gallons of apple cider. Powdered calcium carbonate (carbonate of lime,) or, to give it its common name, precipitated chalk) is a low-priced, harmless chemical available at any drug store. Boil in kettle or vat vigorously for a period of five minutes. Pour the liquid into vessels, preferably glass jars or pitchers, allow to stand six or eight hours, or until perfectly clear. Pour the clear liquid into preserving kettle. Do not allow the sediment at bottom to enter. Add to the clear liquid one level tablespoonful of lime carbonate and stir thoroughly. The process is completed by boiling down rapidly to a clear liquid. Use density gauge or candy thermometer and bring it up to 220 degrees Fahrenheit, or, without thermometer, reduce bulk to one-seventh of original volume. To see whether it is cooked enough, test as you would syrup or candy, by pouring a little of it into cold water. If boiled enough, it should have the consistency of maple syrup. It should not be cooked long enough to harden like candy when tested. When the test shows that the syrup has been cooked enough, pour it into fruit jars, pitchers, etc., and allow it to cool slowly. Slow cooling is important, as otherwise the suspended matter will not settle properly and the syrup will be cloudy. A good way to insure slow cooling is to stand the vessels full of syrup in a bucket or a wash boiler of hot water. They may also be placed in a fireless cooker. The white sediment which settles out during cooling is called "malate of lime" and is a harmless compound of lime with the natural acid of the apple. When the syrup is cooled, it should be stored in fruit jars or bottles. Place the rubber cap or cork in position and tighten. Then place the bottles or cans of syrup in hot water and sterilize for 12 minutes in hot water or wash boiler outfit, 10 minutes in water seal outfit, 8 minutes in steam pressure outfit under five pounds of steam, or five minutes in aluminum pressure cooker under 15 pounds of pressure.

Apple syrup made by this method is a very palatable and high-grade product. It has a flavor much like the thick syrup or jelly which is so often formed when apples are baked with a little sugar. As shown by the Government experts, this apple syrup can be used in cooking with good results, as well as for table uses.

Pie Time.

MARLBOROUGH PIE.—Make apple sauce enough to measure a pint when strained and add to it while hot two tablespoonfuls of butter. Beat the yolks of two eggs, add a cupful of sugar, half the rind of a grated lemon and the juice of a whole lemon, half a cupful of fine cracker crumbs and a pinch of salt. Mix thoroughly and bake in a pie plate lined with crust. When firm add a meringue made from the whites of three or four eggs sweetened with a tablespoonful of sugar for each white and beaten thoroughly. Brown and cool. A little lemon juice may be added to the meringue.

Nut Mince Pie.—A cupful of hickory or walnut meats, two cupfuls of apples chopped fine, a cupful and a half of granulated sugar, a cupful of seeded raisins, half a cupful of vinegar, half a teaspoonful of salt, half a tea-

spoonful of cinnamon. Mix the spices dry with the sugar, then thoroughly mix all the ingredients together. This makes two large pies.

Apple Pie.—Make a rich crust with lots of lard and a little cream of tartar and pinch of soda sifted in flour. Slice apples thin, place around plate till nearly full, then sprinkle a little salt over all the apple, cover with sugar and grate nutmeg or sprinkle cinnamon over the sugar, cover and rub top crust over with milk. Never fill an apple pie too full, then it won't run over. That is what causes so many soggy pies.

Squash Pie.—This is a rival to pumpkin pie in some estimations. Boil the squash slowly, drain thoroughly and mash through a strainer. To a quart of the pulp add a quart of milk, four well beaten eggs, half a teaspoonful of ground ginger, a little nutmeg, a salt-spoonful of salt and four tablespoonfuls of sugar. Line pie plates with a good paste and pour in the filling. This is enough for two pies.

Worth Knowing

When cooking very sour fruit, such as cranberries, add a very little salt to each quart, and it will only take about one-half as much sugar to sweeten.

When there is any danger of children getting so near fire as to ignite cotton dresses add alum to water in which they are rinsed. This renders the fabric fireproof.

To toughen glassware or lamp chimneys fill a pot with cold water and add some common salt. Immerse the glassware in this pot and boil well, then cool slowly.

To whiten clothes which have become yellow soak in buttermilk for one week, then wash as usual, and they will come out white.

Hair mattresses filled with black hair are much better than those filled with white hair which has been bleached and so has lost much of its springiness.

An excellent thing for cleaning wallpaper is bran placed in cheesecloth bags.

Proof That Washington Land is Best

Here are some of the facts that we are driving home in our literature:

The United States government says that the average annual value per acre of all farm crops in Washington is \$20.63. The same average in Iowa is \$14.94.

The average value of all the farm land in Washington is \$44.18. The average value of the farm land in Iowa is \$82.58.

The average production of hay in Washington is 2.22 ton per acre. In Wisconsin it is .148.

The 10-year average per acre of Washington in wheat is 22.4 bushels per acre. In Minnesota it is 13.9.

The Washington farm averages 47.9 bushels of oats. The Kansas farmer 24.9.

The farmer in Washington receives an average price for his butter of 30 1-3 cents. In Indiana the average price is 23 2-3 cents.

Potatoes in Washington yield an average crop of 141 bushels to the acre. In Ohio the average is 86 bushels.

All the figures of the United States government tell the same story. Is there any reason in the world why farm land in the northwest should not some day be worth more than the farm land in these districts that produce so much less?

The great prosperity of the middle western states is certain to be follow-

ed by another period of emigration. We will get the benefit of this movement if we can keep the advantages of our country everlastingly before these people month after month and year after year. This is what we are trying to do at the Spokane Chamber of Commerce.

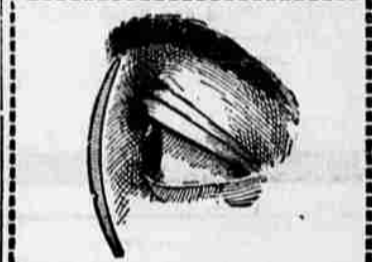
