Prices Open Between 22 and 26 Cents Retail. Ducks and Chickens Attain Holiday Price Foundation Too.

Turkey, duck and chicken prices seem to have struck an even basis locally. Until just recently the turkey and duck market has been rather unsettled but with the near approach of Thanksgiving dealers are now ready to quote prices. Not only do the prices open about on a par with last year, but there will likely be enough turkeys to meet all La Grande demands. Some dealers are not so sure of having enough but others feel no concern over the matter so that the actual turkey-buying season will probably be such as to have enough for all. Marine Branch Shown in Films.

New York, Nov. 17.—(Special) "There isn't a thing that the beggar can't do," sings Kipling in his famous eulogy of the Marine, and it will be affirmed by thousands who see the new movie thriller "The Peacemakers," showing the busy United States Marine in all phases of his everyday life—from operating big guns on a battleship to an actual brush with rebels in Haiti. The new picture soon to be shown from coast to coast will not be exploited as a box-office attraction, but as a timely educational feature. Its main purpose will be to inform the public of the specific duties of the "Soldier of the Sea," as differing from other branches of the service. Uncle Sam's new movie is a two-reel feature and is being loaned to the theatres free of charge by the Marine Corps Recruiting Service. The Marines say that their first mission is to let the public find out who they are and what they do, and the screen is in the thing.

Tart Apple Sauce Pancakes.
Six eggs beaten separately, two cups of milk, two cups of sifted flour, one teaspoon salt. Mix flour and salt, add milk and stir in the well beaten yolks. Beat hard until mixture is very light. Fold in whites of eggs, two to each person, with butter and tart apple sauce, or apple jelly or marmalade. Sprinkle with powdered sugar. Half this recipe is sufficient for a small family.

Fried Apple Custard.
Pare, core and slice four good-sized apples. Fry in butter and when brown on one side turn over and pour over them a custard, made of four eggs beaten, a cupful of cream or new milk and a little cinnamon. Fry to a light brown. Turn out carefully and serve with sifted sugar. This dessert is delicious served hot.
