### PICK PRINCESSES FROM APPLE LAND

Seven Inland Empire Maids Will Hold Court at Spokane Show.

Seven princesses from Apple Land, representing the most important fruit districts in the northwest, will be chosen by popular vote of the people of those districts, to rule with King Pip and Princess Apple Blossom at the ninth National Apple show in Spokane, November 20 to 25.

The social side of the annual apple carnival will revolve around these princesses, who will hall from Walla Walla, Wenatchee, North Yakima, Lewis ton, Missoula, Kaitspell and Hood Riv

er. In each of these places a popular voting contest is to be conducted by one of the newspapers, which will print free ballots for the use of the people in choosing their favorites for the honor.

The princesses will have joint charge of the court with Princess Apple Blossom, who is to be chosen by popular vote of the people of Spokane, and their traveling and other expenses during the show will be borne by the management.

During the week the princesses will participate in a series of brilliant social functions, beginning with the coronation the opening night of the show November 20, and including a series of regal pageants several evenings during the week.

Spokane society will assemble to welcome them at an afternoon tea and a court ball, both in the Davenport hotel, which will be their headquarters during the week.
