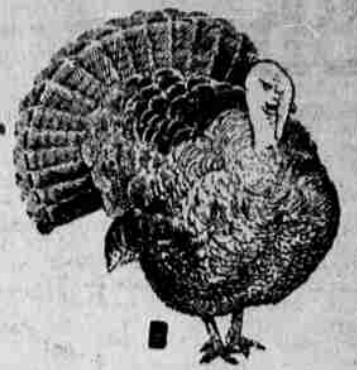
Livestock Exposition At Portland. The Pacific International Livestock Exposition will be held at Union Stock Yards, North Portland, December 4-9, 1916. An extract from the Exposition's catalogue reads: "Owing to the splendid manner in which the Oregon Bankers' Association, the Portland Chamber of Commerce, the State of Oregon and the different breeders' associations have made appropriations, the show this year will take rank with the largest livestock exhibitions in the United States. Between \$20,000 and \$25,000 will be given in cash premiums for livestock. The Shorthorn and Hereford Association of America have made total appropriations of \$5,000 which, being matched by the Exposition makes premiums of \$10,000 for those two breeds alone and insures the strongest kind of competition in this class. Close to \$5000 is being offered in the dairy division, which covers Holsteins, Jerseys, Guernseys and Ayrshires."

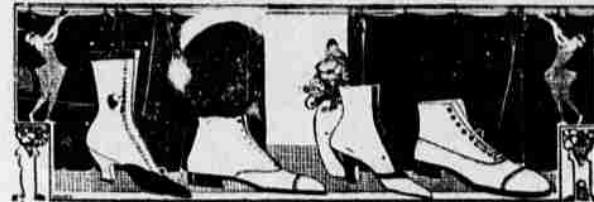
