## SHOW PRIZE FRUIT OF EASTERN STATES

Northwestern Growers Will Compare Their Apples With Competitive Products.

That time-honored question, "How do northwestern apples compare with the apples of the east and middle west?" will be answered for the first time at the ninth National Apple show in Spokane November 20 to 25, when a special feature display of Virginia Winesaps, New York Baldwins and Kansas Jonathans will be shown.

These will be prize apples, the best of the varieties with which northwestern apples must compete in the eastern and middle western markets. The display is under the direction of L. J. Blot, sales manager of the Spokane Fruit Growers' company, who has secured the cooperation of the International Apple Shippers' association in the work.

### Seek New Labels.

Another new feature of the 1916 apple show will be a competition in which certificates will be issued for the best and most valuable box label now in use in handling apples. A committee of advertising experts will judge the labels on attractiveness, suitability and advertising value, and the scoring is designed to show the strength and weakness of each label.

The big feature of the contests between districts will be for the \$250 cash prize offered for the best five boxes grown in the world. The competition will be restricted to the following varieties: Arkansas Black, Delbona, Jonathan, McIntosh, Red Rome Beauty, Spitzenburg, Stayman Winesap, Wagener, Winesap, Winter Banana, White Winter Pearmain and Yellow Newtown.

Miss Drought's charming personality has combined most favorably with her wonderful voice to make her one of the prime favorite of the New York Metropolitan company.

Mildred Haynes possesses a wonderfully clear and brilliant voice. Miss Haynes creates a sensation wherever she sings and particularly dear has she become to her audiences by her interpretation of the folk songs from all nations.

Mary Maiben Allen, is the possessor of one of the most remarkable contralto voices. It might be said that Miss Allen has many voices, so varied are her accomplishments. Miss Allen will sing her dramatic arias in the original operatic costume.

Aubrey N. Eagle's rendition of the Prologue to "Rigliacci" and many other difficult operatic arias has won for him the distinction of possessing one of the most remarkable baritone voices on the operatic stage today. Mr. Eagle's dramatic impersonations render him one of the most deft and facile of actors.

Skovgaard, the Danish violinist, is well known in this country, having made several tours in the past eleven years. He was a pupil of Joseph Joachim and has played before most of the European crowned heads. Skovgaard is introducing to the United States a number of Scandinavian compositions and these promise to be especially interesting from the fact that very little is known of Scandinavian music and that on this occasion they will be played by a Scandinavian. Skovgaard was personally acquainted with Edward Grieg, Norway's greatest composer, and has played most of his compositions with the composer himself.

The pianist of the company is Alice McClung-Skovgaard, one of the most powerful of women pianists.

Among the opera numbers given by the company are scenes from "La Boheme," "Tales of Hoffman," "Madam Butterfly," and the company also gives a rendition of the famous sextette from the opera "Lucia."

again will be held for the purpose of aiding to secure standard grade and pack. The leading shippers and associations in each district will prepare displays to illustrate the range of fruit that they understand should be permitted within the limits of each grade and pack.

In the five-box classes, 23 varieties will compete, and first, second and third prizes of \$25, \$12.00 and \$10, respectively, will be given the winners among each variety.

The one-box contests again will be a feature. First, second and third prizes of \$7.50, \$5 and \$2.50, respectively, will be given the winners among 24 different varieties.

A \$10 prize is offered for the best single-box display of a variety not previously shown at a National Apple show and scoring 90 or better.

The exhibits of pruning, spraying, picking, packing and other equipment will form one of the great features of the show. As the apple growers are making progress along scientific lines, they are becoming more and more interested in doing their work in the best and most modern manner.

### Show Orchard Machinery.

The machinery and other industrial exhibits of last year's National Apple show were seen by thousands of growers and in many ways attracted the greatest attention of anything at the show. These exhibits this year will be larger and more complete.

Again this year there will be a contest between the leading apple shippers of the northwest to determine which can make the best advertising display of its brand of extra fancy apples. Each entry will contain 100 boxes of one variety of apples, strictly standard extra fancy pack, put out by one shipper under one trade mark brand.

The original and attractive feature displays will be open to individuals firms and fruit and commercial organizations. The judges are instructed not to take into consideration the elements of cost and size, but the unique and artistic showing only.
