Sick Seven Days a Year.

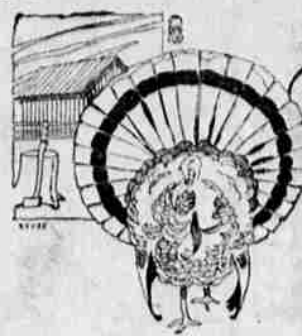

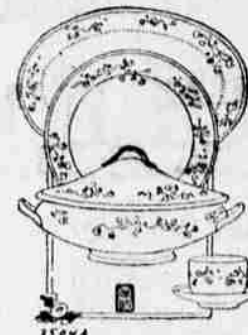
