Postoffice officials are preparing to care for the usual Thanksgiving turkey rush. For those who intend to remember friends via the turkey route, it may be well to know that within 150 miles, the parcel post postage may be figured at the weight of the turkey, properly packed, plus four cents. Beyond the 150 mile limit, the postage may be figured in cents at the rate of two times the weight, plus four cents. It is rather risky to send perishable goods beyond 150 miles unless there is quick railway service, like that to Portland.
