

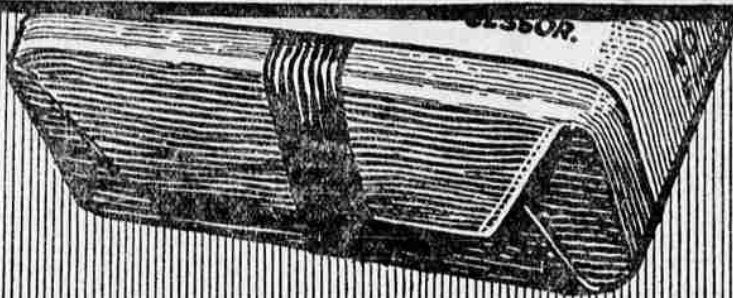

THE OLD ART OF BUYING LINENS

How to Tell Quality by the Weave, the Bleaching and the Roundness of the Threads. Dollies Come Now by the Yard.

THE primary thing to remember in buying linen is the primary thing to remember in buying anything. If the article is cheap and marked down because quality is not good the purchase is worth less than nothing. It always pays to buy good linen, particularly if a woman contemplates the time and trouble of putting embroidery upon it. Excellent embroidery, hemstitching, etc., cannot be done upon poor material, for the better the goods the better the design and durability of the handwork. When the linen threads are strong and round the stitching will be clear and well defined; when the threads are weak, angular and uneven the stitching cannot be artistic or permanent.

The quality of linen, like most wool fabrics, depends upon the way it is prepared. The process of bleaching flax by chemicals is much cheaper and quicker than that by exposure to the air. But the fibers are weakened by such bleaching. The grass bleaching is superior, inasmuch as it does not impair the fibers. It is also more expensive because it takes more time and requires more care. Yet the difference between the two is not more than a cent or so for the embroidery linens.

This is the way in which you may distinguish between the two qualities: A microscopic examination shows that the needle cutting through the chemically bleached goods leaves broken and ragged threads. A puncture of the needle in the grass bleached linen shows that the threads are simply separated by the passage. In one case the threads are bent, in the other broken. The fiber of the chemically prepared is uneven, brittle and inferior. The fiber of the grass bleached is practically unimpaired, so that when the needle is withdrawn and the cloth rubbed and pulled the material is as good as ever.

Dollies by the yard are the latest arrivals on the market. A woven crochone of pretty design has a pretty pattern made in three large ovals. These are closely fitted and are confusing until it is understood that they are to be cut out like paper dolls. Out of a yard of this material you can get a large centerpiece, four plate dollies and six tumbler dollies. The cut-outs must, of course, be finished neatly around the edge with fine white or colored braid or crocheted edges.

A simple crocheted edge is a fillet mesh made by a double crochet stitch, then two chains, and inserting the point of the crochet needle through the turned back edge of the dolly. When the dolly has been surrounded once, make a second row in the same way. Let the double crochet stitches fall on the last ones. This makes a sort of ladder. The third row is made by making a single crochet in the first double crochet of the last row, chain two, a double crochet in the last double crochet and chain five, catching in the last double crochet made, chain two and single crochet in next double stitch again.

How to Cook a Turkey.

Stuff the turkey with your favorite dressing. Fasten wings and legs by running the needle through them and tying securely. Rub softened butter all over the bird before you dredge it with flour. This will keep the skin from breaking. Wash the giblets and place them under the rack of roasting pan and add a little water. Now place the turkey on rack, breast down. As it cooks turn it slowly, so that the breast will be the last place to brown. Baste every fifteen minutes. Add salt and pepper to taste after it has cooked about forty-five minutes. When you add water be sure it is hot. By the time the turkey is cooked you will find that the giblets are both tender and brown and ready to be chopped up for the gravy.

Mighty Nice.

Into deep sherbet glasses put triangles of peaches and bits of any fruit at hand, such as pineapples, skinned Tokay grapes or plums. Sprinkle with broken nut meats and a few stewed raisins. Over all pour sweetened whipped cream and decorate with small pieces of preserved ginger, candied orange peel or cherries.

Tinker's Job Really Secure
New York, Nov. 28. (By Hamilton, United Press Staff Correspondent)—Chicagoans came close, mighty close to having the energies of their two major league clubs directed by men from the minors without previous major league managerial or playing experience.

It was Charlie Weegham, boss of the Cubs who saved the day. His firm stand against the wishes of some

of the other directors prevented the appointment of Jack Hendricks to Tinker's job last month.

Clarence "Pants" Rowland, manager of the White Sox formerly a luminary of the Three-I league, jumped to the Sox management without serving a player's apprenticeship in top-notch company. When Hendricks was in New York a short time ago he told the United Press that he had been offered the helm job by several directors of the National leaguers, but was unable to take it because Weegham

had declared that if Tinker left the Cubs he would leave too. Weegham, according to Hendricks, was considerably strong for Tinker, due to the fact that the latter's leap to the Feds contributed more than any one agency to putting the erstwhile outlaws on their feet. Consequently, Weegham says, Tinker will have that job as long as he is president of the Cubs.
