WASCO IMPROVES ROADS

Bib Sum Voted at November Election to Forward Good Roads Movement.

The Dalles, Ore., Nov. 29.—(Special)—In accordance with the plans made by the County Court of Wasco county at the time the question of bonding Wasco county for \$260,000 to build roads was placed upon the November ballot and was carried by a large majority, the advisory board met with the County court Monday to plan the sale of the bonds, obtaining of a right-of-way and employing a competent engineer to take charge of the work.

The advisory board consisted of one man from the Farmers' Union, one each from The Dalles, Dufur and Mosier, and one jointly for Shaniko and Antelope.

County Judge Gunning spoke briefly on the purpose of the meeting for the disposal of the \$260,000 bonds.

These bonds cannot be sold below par and the interest was limited to five per cent. While some were of the opinion that it would be most advantageous to sell the bonds in one block it was found that they may be sold in sums of from \$50 up. Willis K. Clark, representing Clark Kendall & Company, of Portland, was present and offered the legal services of Eastern attorneys for a consideration, but the court and advisory board concurred in the opinion that District At-

torney Bell was competent to handle the legal end of the matter.

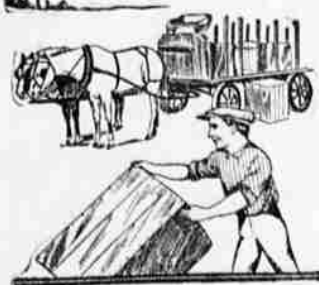
