Lots of Soda Water.

Salem, Nov. 28.—(Special)—According to statistics compiled by the labor commissioner's office, there are ten plants in Oregon manufacturing soda water. These plants have a value of \$73,000. The output is about 18,000 bottles a day. There are also 10 plants manufacturing fruit juices for public use and five for private or neighborhood use. The total output of these plants is 7,423,000 each year.
