Forcible demonstration of this is brought home in a news item carried in the columns of a San Francisco newspaper, chronicling the tale of the victory of the All-Americans and a baseball team in Hawaii.

And the brazenness of the thing was that the box score showed the names of Harold Janvrin, the Red Sox second baseman, and Joe Jack-

son of the White Sox, big as life. In fact, Jackson contributed to the afternoon with three solid whacks. Incidentally one Louis Guisto, lately a member of the Cleveland American league club, also was among those present.

It will be recalled with little difficulty by the baseball fans that Ban Johnson issued a statement just after the close of the baseball season promising dire things to any American league player who would dare start on a barn-storming tour. The statement followed the performance in an exhibition game of several Red Sox players.

It all goes to show that in a baseball player's life there is considerable enthusiasm for the winter growth of growth of baseball dollars, and considerable disrespect for the solemn utterings of a league president. Johnson's ability to exar around the American league might be put to a test with a heavy fine and suspensions being plastered onto the three offenders.

LIVING COSTS BEFORE SOLONS

New York Legislature to Delve Into Many Problems When It Meets January Third—Charities Scandal to Be Rattled.

Albany, N. Y., Dec. 11.—(United Press.)—Many matters now claiming the attention of the people will be brought up for consideration in the Senate and Assembly convening January 3. One of these is the high cost of living. The Wicks investigation committee, it is expected will make a report and recommend legislation which will lighten the burdens of the consumers. Efforts will be made to secure legislation which will provide market facilities in New York and other large cities with a view of eliminating the middleman. An act of this nature will be urged by John J. Dillon, State Food and Market Commissioner.

It is expected bills will be introduced to carry out the recommendations of Charles H. Strong, Governor Whitman's investigator of the management and affairs of the State Board of Charities. Strong recommended a reorganization of the State Board, favoring a commission of nine instead of the present unpaid board of twelve. Strong also recommended the abolition of the office of Fiscal Supervisor of State Charities, created during the administration of Governor B. B. Odell. On the other hand petitions from charitable associations will be sent to the legislature urging that no change be made in the present form of the Board.

The Mayor's conference representing many cities of the State has started a new campaign for home rule legislation. The mayors ask for a constitutional amendment which will meet the demand for genuine municipal home rule by delegating to cities definite power to legislate on local matters and by prohibiting special local legislation in the State Legislature.

State Engineer Frank M. Williams will urge the enactment of the legislation which will establish a large canal traffic bureau. The object of the proposed bureau is to attract freight to the canal.

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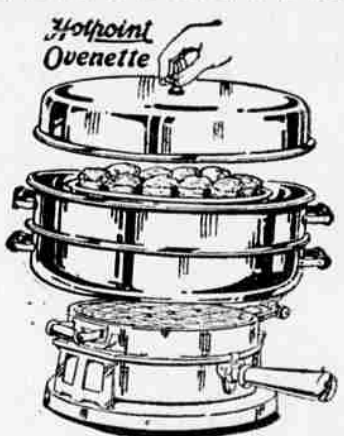


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
