Tuberculosis Victim Turned Away—
RedCross Seals Would Have
Saved Her.

She seemed like a pretty child as she sat in the revolving chair before the doctor at the Tuberculosis Clinic. The history sheet showed her to be sixteen years old. It also conveyed the information that she had been referred to the tuberculosis division by the nurse employed by a local corporation to watch the health of employees. "Please, doctor, let me go back to work," she pleaded.
The doctor glanced at the chart and noted that on Sept. 9th, the day when she first visited the clinic, she weighed 119 pounds, and that she now weighs 113½. He looked at her drooping shoulders, at her narrow chest, at her tired brown eyes. He glanced at the result of the sputum analysis. "Positive" it read in big accusing letters. All the signs before him were eloquent of rapid decline.
