William Carson Dies From Shock. Baker, Dec. 14.—(Special)—William Carson, an employee of the Baker White Pine Lumber company, died at the hospital yesterday afternoon from the shock of an injury he received while working in the company's logging camp near White Pine.

A log rolled upon Carson, causing a compound fracture of his thigh. The injured man was brought to Baker last night and received immediate attention, but scarcely recovered consciousness before death.

He was about 45 years of age and as far as is known had no relatives near Baker.
