The Sale of Red Cross stamps is progressing splendidly and a great many of the seals have been disposed of. The indications leave no room for doubt that this year's sales will far exceed all those previous.

The Neighborhood club has charge of their sale and to date nearly half of them have been sold. They have been put on sale at the various drug stores and special days have been reserved for the same at the postoffice.

This is only one of a hundred communities that are doing active work in their disposal. Re-orders are keeping the headquarters at Portland busy and it is safe to assert that at least 500,000 pieces of mail, Christmas packages and the like will be stamped with these seals.

The proceeds from the sale must go entirely—except 10 per cent, that pays for expense—to the organized fight against tuberculosis.

If every person in La Grande bought two, La Grande would be able to contribute over \$100 to the fund. Surely, we can spare at least a few cents each in the great saving of human lives which is being accomplished by the association.
