Mrs. W. H. Hamilton, of La Grande, was a visitor in Pendleton Saturday, according to the Pendleton Tribune.

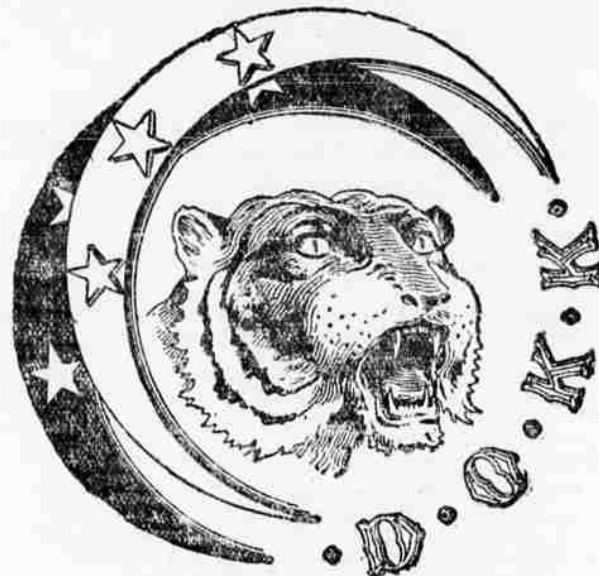
