FINE CHURCH IS DEDICATED

Catholics of Pendleton Enjoy New Edifice—Ceremony Solemn.

Pendleton, Dec. 19.—(Special)—Sunday, Dec. 17, was an historic day for the Catholic church in Pendleton. Worshippers of all denominations were drawn by the bright sunshine to witness the impressive ceremonies of the dedication of the beautiful new church home.

At 9:30 a. m. the Rt. Rev. Bishop O'Reilly, accompanied by Rev. J. Dungan, S. J., Rev. T. Neate, S. J., Rev. E. H. Brown, S. J., and Rev. A. Stern, S. J., began the blessing of the exterior walls of the massive new edifice. The litanies of the saints were then chanted by the clergy at the foot of the altar, while the congregation was still waiting outside the entrance.

As soon as the doors of the new church were opened to the people for the first time, more than 400 Knights of Columbus marched in a body into the church and occupied the front pews while the rest of the seats were taken by the members of St. Mary's parish and many non-Catholics of Pendleton and vicinity. Every chair was taken.

At 10 o'clock Pontifical High Mass began. After the gospel Bishop O'Reilly preached a forcible sermon befitting the occasion. The music rendered by St. Mary's choir, under the leadership of S. J. Lynch, was inspiring and adapted to the solemnity.

SINGERS TO REHEARSE FOR CHRISTMAS EVE

Tomorrow evening promptly at 7:30 all choirs of the different churches participating in the municipal Christmas tree program, to be held Sunday evening at Fourth and Depot street, where a large tree will be lighted for the occasion, will meet at the Y. M. C. A. to rehearse the Christmas anthems and carols to be sung. At least 50 are expected to be out. Mrs. J. P. Graham is chairman of the music committee and desires all choir leaders to have their respective choirs on hand. The rehearsal will be a brief one but it is important.

Mistake Causes Excitement.

Pendleton, Dec. 19.—(Special)—John Dungan, a young railroad man of Pendleton, died at St. Vincent's hospital in Portland on the morning of the 14th, according to a letter received by the East Oregonian yesterday morning. The fact that there are two John Dungans who are Pendleton railroad men and that both have been in St. Vincent's hospital led to a mistake of almost serious consequences.

The deceased John Dungan, as far as can be learned, was a member of a family living at Rieth. John B. Dungan, an O. W. brakeman, is the husband of one of the daughters of Mrs. J. G. Rankin of 201 Garden street. He was recently injured in a fall from a box car and was sent to St. Vincent's hospital. When the news of the death of John Dungan arrived today, the East Oregonian called on the Rankin home to learn details. They had had no news of the death of their relative and the letter, read to them over the telephone, was a great shock, particularly to Mrs. Dungan. A long-distance telephone call to St. Vincent's hospital, however, soon dispelled their fears and explained the report. They then remembered that the other John Dungan had also been sent to the hospital.
