### ECHAGUE, SPANISH ARTIST WHOM KING ALFONSO SAT TO, ARRIVES IN NEW YORK

New York, Jan. 5.—(United Press)—Quite a ripple of excitement is running across the surface of Gotham society today over the arrival of the youthful and handsome Spanish court painter, Ortiz Echague (pronounced Ay-chawg-way). Senor Echague is quite the vogue in the society colonies of the Eastern United States, a number of whose most charming feminine members he has been commissioned to paint.

Perhaps more interest than the display of any single picture ever has caused in Buenos Aires is being shown by art critics in the portrait, now on exhibition, of Mrs. Rosa Menditegui, one of the leading figures in Argentine society, by Echague.

Echague, who is among the best-known of the younger Spanish generation of artists, began his real career in Madrid in 1908, following his return from the Spanish Academy of Art, in Rome, where, as the holder of a scholarship awarded by the Madrid government he spent five years. During 1908, 1909 and 1910 he obtained high awards in numerous national and international contests and had, as sitters, many of the leading women of the Spanish nobility.

Then followed a tour of Europe, in which the young artist won especial successes in Italy and Holland, and later in Paris. The most conspicuous mark of approval which, up to that time, he had received, was bestowed upon him in 1913, when he was summoned to the royal palace in Madrid to paint a portrait of King Alfonso, which his majesty presented to Czar Nicholas.

Echague was in Buenos Aires in November, when he left for New York to execute several important commissions in the United States.

His paintings are pronounced by critics as among the most brilliant and original examples of the modern Spanish school.

### Wins Fight for New Rate.

Spokane, Wash., Jan. 5.—(Special)—Ending a long contest between the Pacific northwest and California, the interstate commerce commission has issued an order which permits travelers from the east to visit California by way of Spokane, Seattle and Portland without additional charge.

Heretofore it has cost \$17.50 more for a trip to California via Spokane than by the routes via Denver, El Paso or New Orleans. The state public service commission of Washington filed a complaint against this charge with the Interstate Commerce Commission, which has directed that the railroads cease demanding or participating in all-year excursion fares or summer tourist fares from Chicago to San Francisco, applicable in either direction by way of the northwest, in excess of the corresponding fares by way of New Orleans or El Paso.

Northwestern business men hailed the ruling with delight, as they declare the "arbitrary" charge has proved a serious handicap to the full development of the North Pacific states. Plans already are being made for the cities of this section to combine in an energetic campaign to induce tourists to visit here during their "See America First" trips. They have organized the Pacific Northwest Tourist association, and are seeking appropriations from the states of Oregon and Washington and the province of
