GERM MURDER CASE DROPPED AFTER SEVEN YEARS!

After seven years of suspense, Dr. Clark B. Hyde has been cleared of the charge of murdering Col. Thomas H. Swope, Kansas City millionaire.

Dr. Hyde was Swope's son-in-law and family physician. Charges were that Dr. Hyde infected the drinking water of the Swope house with germs so he and his wife would inherit the \$10,000,000 Swope estate.

Dr. Hyde was tried three times. The third trial has just ended with prosecution ordered dropped.

The case went from Tillamook county and the purchaser of the tax certificate paid \$10 for it. The property it represented was worth \$7000. Everything was legal in the proceedings until the sheriff came to sell the property. The law holds the sale shall be made in this manner: Starting with an offer at the east line of the property and offering so much as will satisfy the tax certificate holder's outlay. It might occur there would be no bid until the entire property was offered and in that event, if the proceeding had gone as intended by law, there would be no way for the original owner to recover.

In this instance the records showed no compliance with the requirement to sell commencing at the east line and offering as much as would satisfy the claim. In other words, the sheriff had not proceeded legally and the court, upon a suit being brought by the original owner, to recover, held he was entitled to his land upon payment of the \$110 to the holder of the tax certificate and sheriff's deed.

Whether this decision will affect similar speculators in Lane county is not known, but it is said many whose lands have been sold fully expect to obtain them back on points of technicality.
