RANCH NEAR HAINES SOLD

W. M. Sieg Buys H. H. Little Place—Will Farm Property in Spring as Soon as Weather Permits.

Baker, Jan. 12.—(Special)—The H. H. Little ranch, three miles northwest of Haines, was sold yesterday to W. M. Sieg of Baker for \$16,000. The ranch includes 140 acres.

Mr. Sieg has been farming near Baker for several years and will move to his newly purchased property in the spring as soon as the weather will permit him to cultivate the land.

The ranch is said to be suitable for stock and grain raising and for general agriculture.

Mr. Little, the former owner, resides at Cove and has been renting the ranch to tenants.

Strange Sights Seen During Explosions

Shells Fall on Village of Kingsland, New Jersey, When Plant of Car and Foundry Company Is Destroyed

Kingsland, N. J., Jan. 12.—(United Press)—Strange sights were seen as shells swept around this village during the foundry plant explosions last night.

Men, women and children wondrously clad struggled homeward through the interminable shelling.

They experienced sensations similar to war zone fighting.

Many families were separated during flight following the first explosions. They were wandering aimlessly this afternoon hunting husbands and wives.

The plant of the Canadian Car & Foundry Company, one-half mile east of Kingsland, N. J., in which were stored hundreds of thousands of shells destined for the Russian government, was destroyed late last night by fire and a series of explosions which continued for three hours. So far as could be learned no one was killed or injured, although it was said 17 workmen were missing.

No estimate of the loss was obtainable, but it was said it might reach \$4,000,000.
