Women Find New Places for Activity

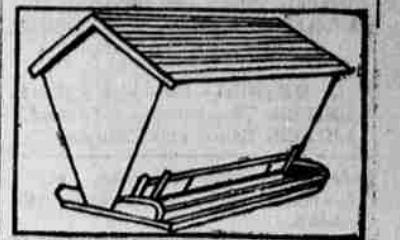

Last Country Seat on Manhattan Sold

New York, January 18—(Special)—The last country seat that remains on Manhattan Island has been sold, it is announced, and hereafter the greatest borough in the city of New York will have no estate with a mansion on it to which the owner may invite his friends. The final place of the sort to go is Tryon Hall, and it is situated on the historic site at Washington Heights, where Fort Tryon of Revolutionary days existed. Lately it has been owned by C. K. G. Billings, noted as a horse owner and millionaire. He must necessarily be the latter, for Tryon Hall could only be maintained by one of the great wealth, as it means something like two million dollars of unproductive capital to the possessor. Its situation is the best asset of the estate, however for it stands high above the Hudson River, in one of the healthiest parts of the city. New Yorkers have long since become used to the experience of seeing its more or less luslone land marks destroyed and they will find what confersation they can have in this instance in fact that the land so long practically uninhabited may become available, in one way or another, to the uses of the people generally.

Nationalism Must Be Discarded to Bring Lasting Peace

By Sir RABINDRANATH TAGORE, Bengalese Poet and Nobel Prize Winner

AMERICA has the figure of youth, and all that is best in western civilization will eventually find lodgment here. The other nations of the west will have to accept this, because it will be evident that the hand of America is cleaner.

THE WAR, TO MY MIND, IS THE OUTCOME OF OVERGROWN MATERIALISM, OF AN IDEAL BASED ON SELF INTEREST AND NOT BASED ON HARMONY.

There are differences between capital and labor because both are working in the interest of their own selves. Peace is but temporary, and other clashes are bound to come. The self interest of nations is the same.

A new readjustment of things is necessary, a new age, when the idea of nationalism will be discarded, when colonies, the storm centers of the world, will be discarded. I think the war has proved this quite conclusively.

Worth Knowing

When dampening clothes that have become too dry for ironing use warm water. It penetrates more quickly than cold and less of it is required, so that the ironing may be begun sooner.

When ironing handkerchiefs begin ironing in the middle. Ironing the edges first causes the middle to swell out and makes it very difficult to iron and fold them properly. Test the iron on a piece of rag or paper to prevent any accident by scorching.

Mother-of-pearl should never be washed with soap, for it discolors and destroys the brilliancy of the shell. The right method of cleaning is with whitening and cold water.

To clean marble take two parts of soda, one of pumice and one of salt (all in powder) and mix to a paste with water. Rub this vigorously on the marble and wash off with salt water. Finish with clean cold water and a soft cloth.

Corn breads are always heavy when sweet milk is substituted for sour and the soda is not changed to baking powder.
